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


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INTRODUCTION

This issue of Statistics of Communications Common Carriers contains financial and operating data for the year 1970. The information was taken principally from annual and monthly reports filed by the carriers with the Federal Communications Commission. This publication has been issued annually since 1939. Previous to 1957 it was titled "Statistics of the Communications Industry in the United States."

All communications carriers engaged in interstate or foreign communication service, except those that operate solely through connection with the facilities of an unaffiliated carrier, are subject to all the common carrier provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

Subject telephone carriers which operate telephone exchanges and have operating revenues in excess of \$1,000,000, and those which do not operate telephone exchanges but operate to overseas points or in the Maritime radio services and have annual operating revenues in excess of \$50,000 are required to file annual reports with the Commission.

Telegraph carriers which have annual operating revenues in excess of \$50,000 are required to file annual reports. Companies controlling communications common carriers whose annual revenues exceed \$2,500,000 are also required to file annual reports. Annual reports for the year 1970 were filed by 58 telephone carriers, 7 telegraph carriers and 11 controlling companies. An annual report was also filed by the Communications Satellite Corporation.

Telephone carriers whose annual operating revenues exceed \$1,000,000 and telegraph carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$250,000 are also required to file condensed monthly reports of financial and operating data.

Part I of this volume contains information concerning all reporting carriers.

Part II contains financial and operating data relating to telephone carriers. Summaries for all reporting telephone carriers and for Bell companies are included, as well as data by individual carriers. "Bell companies," as used in this publication, represents the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, its principal telephone subsidiaries, and Cincinnati Bell, Inc. and The Southern New England Telephone Company.

It is estimated that, on the basis of assets and of revenues, the telephone carriers reporting to the Commission as fully subject

carriers represent about 90 percent of the telephone industry in the United States.

The gross book cost of communication plant of the reporting telephone companies was \$59,872,291,000 as of December 31, 1970, as compared with \$53,694,521,000 as of December 31, 1969, an increase of 12 percent. The total operating revenues reported by these carriers for the year 1970 were \$18,222,938,000 as compared with \$16,822,838,000 for the year 1969, an increase of 8 percent; and the total operating expenses, excluding taxes, amounted to \$11,652,425,000 as compared with \$10,294,389,000 for the preceding year, an increase of 13 percent.

In compiling summary figures for telephone companies, duplications between the Bell companies with respect to securities, receivables, payables and items of income and expense, except in minor instances, have been eliminated.

Data relating to the larger non-subject telephone carriers, supplied voluntarily by those carriers, are shown in Table 17 of this issue.

Part III of this volume contains data relating to domestic and overseas telegraph carriers. The telegraph carriers reporting to the Commission, along with record communications business reported by telephone companies, represent practically all of the telegraph industry in the United States.

The gross book cost of communication plant of the domestic telegraph carrier amounted to \$1,029,149,000 as of December 31, 1970, as compared with \$968,401,000 as of December 31, 1969, an increase of 6 percent. The operating revenues of the domestic telegraph carrier for the year 1970 amounted to \$402,456,000 and the operating expenses, excluding taxes, amounted to \$351,557,000 as compared with \$391,338,000 and \$341,942,000, respectively, representing increases of 3 percent in both revenues and expenses as compared with the year 1969.


The gross book cost of communication plant of overseas telegraph carriers was \$351,674,000 as of December 31, 1970, as compared with \$320,629,000 as of December 31, 1969, an increase of 10 percent. The operating revenues of the overseas telegraph carriers for the year 1970 amounted to \$193,808,000 and the operating expenses, excluding taxes, amounted to \$148,378,000 as compared with \$179,993,000 and \$135,386,000, respectively, representing increases of 8 percent in revenues and 10 percent in expenses as compared with the year 1969.

Part IV of this volume includes the balance sheet and income statement of the Communications Satellite Corporation.

Part V of this volume shows the intercorporate relations of all the subject carriers reporting to the Commission and the controlling companies.

1/ Represents the excess of charges to income tax expense by some companies who, for tax purposes but not for accounting purposes, used liberalized depreciation methods recognized by Section 167 of the Internal Revenue Code along with "normalization" tax accounting, over credits to income tax expense by other companies who in past years used liberalized depreciation for tax purposes along with "normalization" tax accounting but later either ceased using liberalized depreciation or switched to "flow through" tax accounting and are amortizing to income tax expense the previously accumulated provisions for future taxes.


2/ Western Union Telegraph Co. had an estimated net reduction in Federal income tax expense of \$5,300,000 arising from the utilization, for income tax purposes but not for accounting purposes, of a liberalized depreciation method recognized by Section 167 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. It also had an estimated net increase in Federal income tax expense of \$57,000 arising from the use for tax purposes in prior years of five-year amortization authorized under Section 168 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. The accumulated net balance at December 31, 1970, of liberalized depreciation and five-year amortization income tax differentials accounted for on the "flow through" basis was \$59,148,000.

3/ Represents credits to income tax expense by ITT World Communications, Inc., which prior to 1961, for tax purposes but not for accounting, used liberalized depreciation methods recognized by Section 167 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 along with "normalization" tax accounting. The provisions in the accounts for deferred taxes are being amortized in equal amounts over the years commencing in 1962. ITT World Communications, Inc., RCA Global Communications, Inc. and Western Union International, Inc. had for the year 1970 net reductions in Federal income tax expense of \$1,363,824, \$2,094,000 and \$467,000, respectively, arising from the utilization, for income tax purposes but not for accounting purposes, of liberalized depreciation which was accounted for on the "flow through" basis. The accumulated amounts of liberalized depreciation income tax differentials accounted for on the "flow through" basis since that basis was adopted at various dates were \$5,322,824, \$12,966,000 and \$2,439,000 for the three companies in the same order.

4/ Western Union Telegraph Co. was unable to use its investment tax credit applicable to 1970 of approximately \$1,800,000 due to the absence of tax liability.




In addition, until Sept. 16, 1965, Hawaiian furnished RCA Global Communications, Inc. two telegraph channels in the telephone cable between Honolulu and San Francisco as part payment (in addition to \$12,000 per month) for the latter maintaining for Hawaiian standby radiotelephone facilities in Hawaii. The bulk of the overseas private line revenues, except those from the overseas telegraph carriers, are from agencies of the U.S. Government.

Note.—Data shown in this table are compiled from AT&T's response to Part 43761 of the Commission's Rules and represents all overseas message telephone traffic which either originated or terminated in the continental United States, excluding Alaska. Beginning with the year 1968 overseas telephone data as reported herein excludes data on calls which transited the facilities of the telephone company, which have been included in all prior years and therefore such years' data are not comparable. In 1970, AT&T reported that it handled some 5,975,000 inbound transiting minutes of telephone conversations, and some 5,973,000 outbound transiting minutes of telephone conversations out of a claimed total of 206,705,000 overseas minutes handled. These data vary somewhat from the message counts and revenues shown in Table 13. The data in such table contains substantial revenues reported by four carriers from calls handled jointly with AT&T, principally to or from Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands and Cuba. It also contains a relatively small number of calls, and revenues from calls, which AT&T did not participate in handling.









TV program transmission across the Atlantic Ocean began in mid-1965 and across the Pacific Ocean in late 1966. Beginning in late 1968 an Atlantic satellite was used for TV service in and out of Puerto Rico upon availability of the earth station there. Beginning in 1969, upon completion of earth stations in Latin American countries, use of an Atlantic satellite commenced for TV service in and out of this area. Several U.S. carriers, including both telephone and telegraph, participate in offering this service, one at a time, on a rotation basis, except in Hawaii where the Hawaiian Telephone Co. handles all overseas TV. The TV usage and revenues of these carriers were:

There was a substantial reduction in rates for TV effective early in 1969. This apparently accounts for the relatively small growth in 1969 revenues as compared to 1968, however, an explanation of the 1970 decrease in revenues is not so apparent.

The accumulated net balance at December 31, 1970 of liberalized depreciation and five-year amortization income tax differentials accounted for on the "flow through" basis was \$59,148,000.
- 2/ The liberalized depreciation income tax differentials accumulated in the accounts of Mackay (ITT World) during the years 1954 through 1960 are being amortized in equal amounts over ten years beginning January 1, 1962, to provision for Federal Income Taxes. Note.--Notes to financial statements as published by Comsat have been omitted. Earth stations commenced operation on the island of Guam and in Alaska on November 2, 1969 and July 1, 1970, respectively. Launching of satellites of the series III was completed in 1970 with the launching of satellites numbered 6, 7 and 8. Of these three 1970 launches, two were successful and one was a failure. Satellite history is that Comsat purchased two satellites of its series I of which only one (Early Bird) was launched. It purchased five satellites of its series II but launched only four of them with three of the four being completely successful. However, as noted, all eight of the series III satellites were launched but three of the eight were failures. As calendar 1970 ended Comsat was readying itself for the first launch of an Intelsat IV series satellite and such a launch was made successfully on January 25, 1971.

Comsat's plan of accounting calls for satellites to be depreciated over fixed periods without regard to whether they were ever launched, or whether the launches were successful, and depreciation continues over these fixed periods even though a satellite fails in orbit or its use is discontinued for other reasons. An exception was accorded the first of the Intelsat II series which was launched October 26, 1966 and failed to achieve synchronous orbit and was treated as a separate subdivision of satellite system development costs (amortized over 36 months from May 1, 1967 on a straight line basis) until its retirement from the accounts in 1970 (this retirement is the reason that in the above comparative balance sheet satellite system development costs declined over \$4 million and the accumulated provision for amortization of satellite system development costs declined, net, by over \$2.5 million). The fixed depreciation lives of the satellites are 36 months for those of the Intelsat II series and 60 months for those of the Intelsat III series. All satellites of the Intelsat II series had been fully depreciated in the accounts sometime in 1970 just prior to the end of the year but since some use, either actual or standby, was still being made, they were not retired from the accounts.

Earth stations are considered as having approximately ten-year lives for depreciation purposes. The laboratories building is assigned a life of 40 years but equipment in it is depreciated over 5 years. Satellite system development costs (other than the unsuccessful satellite mentioned just above) are being amortized over 10 years commencing May 1, 1967 by a reverse sum-of-the-years-digits method. Research and development costs are being capitalized, and each six-months' accumulation is being amortized on a straight-line basis, over a period of 60 months, beginning with the first day of the following semi-annual period.

A new item in the 1970 balance sheet is miscellaneous physical property. This \$5,948,915 represents accumulated costs, including interest during construction, incurred by Comsat in connection with the acquisition of the fifth through the eighth satellites of the Intelsat IV series. This exception to the general accounting classification was requested in Commission letters of November 19, 1969 and January 26, 1970 and reflected the Commission's feeling that Comsat had not fully justified an unqualified authorization for the purchase of the four satellites.

Certain costs, primarily satellite system development, research and development and unsuccessful satellites, were capitalized in the accounts but treated as reductions in taxable income for income tax purposes. This tax treatment resulted in Comsat having no taxable income from the time it commenced business through 1969. In 1970, however, Comsat's tax loss carryovers were exhausted and it reported \$5,347,000 of income taxes actually payable after deducting \$649,000 of investment credits realized. Without taxable income, Comsat could not realize on its investment credits at all until 1970 and even then could realize only a part of those carried forward. The unused investment credits at December 31, 1970 were \$1,628,000 which Comsat expects to realize fully in future years. Comsat is using the service life flow-through method of accounting for investment credits realized with the flowed-through amounts appearing "below the line" in the income statement since Comsat contends that under provisions of the Internal Revenue Code its revenue requirements may not be reduced by investment credits. Comsat's income statement in 1969 showed income tax expense even though none was payable and in 1970 shows such expense in a greater amount than was payable for the year. This is a result of Comsat having followed the practice of recording calculated tax amounts with offsetting entries to provision for deferred income taxes. This provision will be consumed over future years by the tax values of depreciation or amortization of such as satellite system development costs, research and development and costs of unsuccessful satellites which reduce income for accounting purposes but not for income tax purposes.


