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INTRODUCTION

This issue of Statistics of Communications Common Carriers contains financial and operating data for the year 1962. The information was taken principally from annual and reports filed by the carriers with the Federal Communications Commission. This publication has been issued annually since 1939. Previous to 1957 it was titled "Statistics of the Communications Industry in the United States".

All communications carriers engaged in interstate or foreign communication service except those so engaged solely through connection with the facilities of another unaffiliated carrier, are subject to all the common carrier provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. Telephone companies having annual operating revenues exceeding \$100,000; telegraph, ocean-cable and radio-telegraph carriers whose annual operating revenues exceed \$50,000 are required to file annual reports with the Commission. Telephone companies required to file annual reports are classified into class A, those having annual revenues exceeding \$250,000, and class B, those having annual revenues exceeding \$100,000 but not exceeding \$250,000. Companies controlling communications common carriers whose annual revenues exceed \$2,500,000 are also required to file annual reports. Annual reports for the year 1962 were filed by 73 telephone carriers, 9 telegraph carriers and 8 controlling companies. Telephone carriers whose annual operating revenues exceed \$1,000,000 and telegraph carriers whose annual operating revenues exceed \$250,000 are also required to file condensed reports of financial and operating data.

Part I of this volume contains information concerning all reporting carriers.

Part II contains financial and operating data relating to telephone carriers. Statistics for all subject telephone carriers and for the Bell companies are included, as well as for individual carriers. "Bell companies" as used in this publication represents the American Telephone and Telegraph Company, its principal telephone subsidiaries, and The Connecticut Telephone Company and Suburban Bell Telephone Company and The Southern New England Telephone Company. It is estimated that, on the basis of assets and of revenues, the telephone carriers reported to the Commission represent about 90 percent of the telephone industry in the United States. The book cost of communication plant of the reporting telephone companies was \$29,953,627, December 31, 1962, as compared with \$27,723,990,000 as of December 31, 1961, an increase of 8 percent. The total operating revenues reported by these carriers for the year 1962 was \$9,517,502,000 as compared with \$8,901,063,000 for the year 1961, an increase of 7 percent. The total operating expenses, excluding taxes, amounted to \$5,622,553,000 as compared with \$5,305,719,000 for the preceding year, an increase of 6 percent. In compiling summaries for telephone companies duplications between Bell companies with respect to securities, payables and items of income and expense, except in minor instances, have been eliminated.

Data relating to the larger non-subject telephone carriers, supplied voluntarily by the carriers, are shown in Table 18 of this issue.

INTRODUCTION -- continued

Part III of this volume contains data relating to domestic and international carriers. The telegraph carriers reporting to the Commission, along with record communication business reported by telephone companies, represent practically all of the telegraph business in the United States. The gross book cost of communication plant of the domestic telegraph carriers amounted to \$541,419,000 as of December 31, 1962, as compared with \$434,933,000 as of December 31, 1961, an increase of 24 percent. The gross book cost of communication plant of the international telegraph carriers was \$163,360,000 as of December 31, 1962, as compared with \$151,000 as of December 31, 1961, a decrease of 5 percent. The operating revenue of domestic telegraph carriers for the year 1962 amounted to \$264,119,000 and the operating expenses, excluding taxes, amounted to \$245,749,000 as compared with \$265,727,000 and \$265,938,000, respectively, representing a decrease of less than 1 percent in revenues and a decrease of 1 percent in expenses as compared with the year 1961. The operating revenue of international telegraph carriers for the year 1962 amounted to \$92,372,000 and the operating expenses, excluding taxes, amounted to \$77,401,000 as compared with \$90,048,000 and \$77,401,000, respectively, representing increases of 3 percent in revenues and 5 percent in expenses for the year 1962.

Part IV of this volume shows the intercorporate relations of all the subject carriers and their controlling companies reporting to the Commission.

- 1/ U.S. Government income taxes applicable to Western Union's domestic telegraph and ocean-cable systems have been shown separately under domestic telegraph carrier and ocean-cable carriers. Other taxes reported by Western Union have not been segregated but are shown under domestic telegraph carrier.
- 2/ Represents credits to income tax expense by companies who, for tax purposes but not for accounting, used liberalized depreciation methods recognized by Section 167 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 in prior years along with "normalization" tax accounting. They have now either ceased using liberalized depreciation or have switched to "flow-through" tax accounting and are amortizing to income tax expense the previously accumulated provisions for future taxes.
- 3/ Western Union Telegraph Co. had an estimated net reduction in Federal income tax expense of \$4,965,000 (including \$675,000 related to prior years) arising from the utilization, for income tax purposes but not for accounting purposes, of a liberalized depreciation method recognized by Section 167 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. It also had an estimated net increase of \$217,000 in Federal income tax expense arising from the use in prior years of five-year amortization authorized under Section 168 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. The accumulated net balance at December 31, 1962 of liberalized depreciation and five-year amortization income tax differentials accounted for on the "flow through" basis was \$18,523,000.
- 4/ These amounts represent credits to income tax expense by companies in the American Cable and Radio Corporation group who, through 1960, for tax purposes but not for accounting, used liberalized depreciation methods recognized by Section 167 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 along with "normalization" tax accounting. The provisions in the accounts for deferred taxes are being amortized in equal annual amounts over ten years commencing in 1962. The A.C. & R. companies in 1962 also had total net reductions of \$249,000 in Federal income tax expense from the utilization for tax purposes of liberalized depreciation which was accounted for on the "flow through" basis. The accumulated amount of liberalized depreciation income tax differentials accounted for on the "flow through" basis for the years 1961 and 1962 was \$485,000. Similarly, RCA Communications, Inc. permitted \$528,000 to "flow through" with the accumulated amount of liberalized depreciation income tax differentials for the years 1957 to 1962, inclusive, amounting to \$1,736,000.
- 5/ These normalization charges were made to miscellaneous deductions from income under interim accounting authority granted by F.C.C. Order of November 20, 1962. It is to be noted that 48% of the amounts represent outright reductions in taxes and only 52% represent what may be termed taxes deferred. Relatively minor amounts of investment credits were allowed to "flow through" by telephone carriers. The radiotelegraph carriers permitted investment credits totaling in excess of \$200,000 to "flow through." Some income normalization resulted from insignificant charges to regular income tax accruals by telephone carriers. The domestic telegraph carrier was unable to utilize its \$350,000 investment credit in 1962. Radiotelegraph carriers also had small amounts they were unable to utilize.

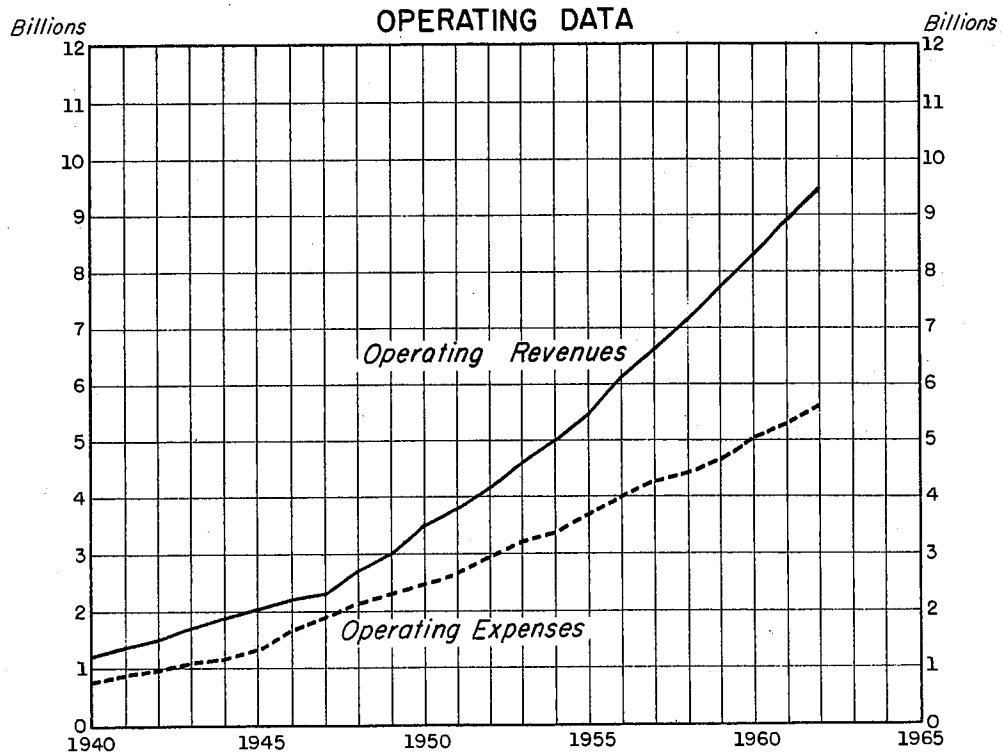
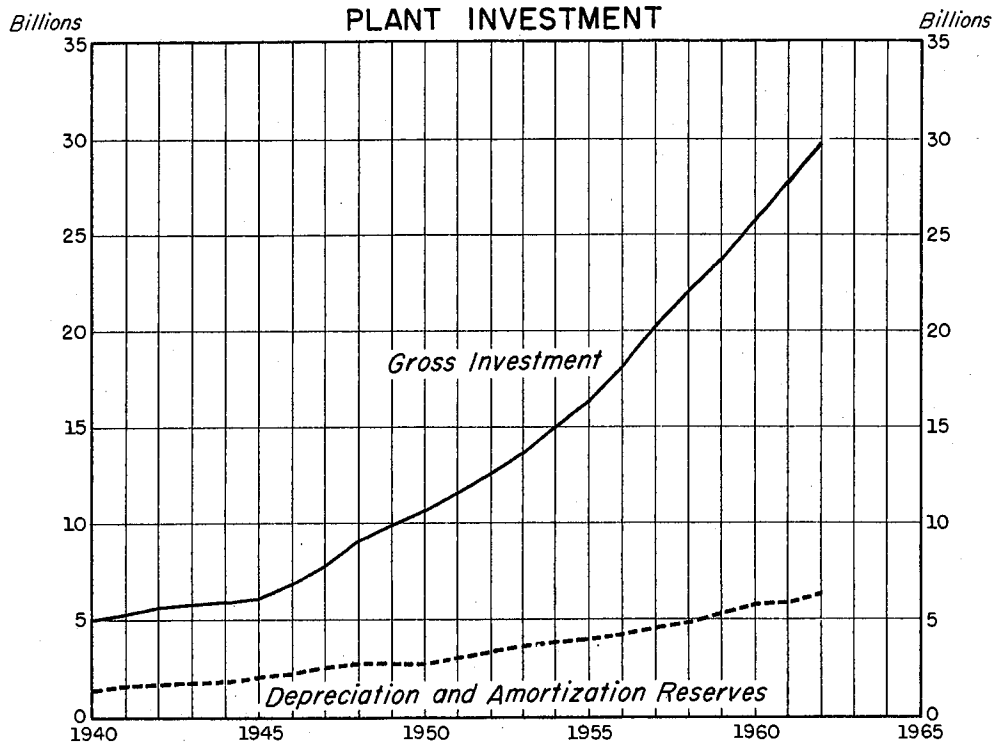

In addition, Hawaiian furnished RCA Communications, Inc. in 1960, 1961 and 1962, and for some time prior, two telegraph channels in the telephone cable between Honolulu and San Francisco as part payment (in addition to \$12,000 per month) for the latter maintaining for Hawaiian standby radio-telephone facilities in Hawaii. The bulk of the overseas private line revenues, except those from the international telegraph carriers, are from agencies of the U. S. Government.

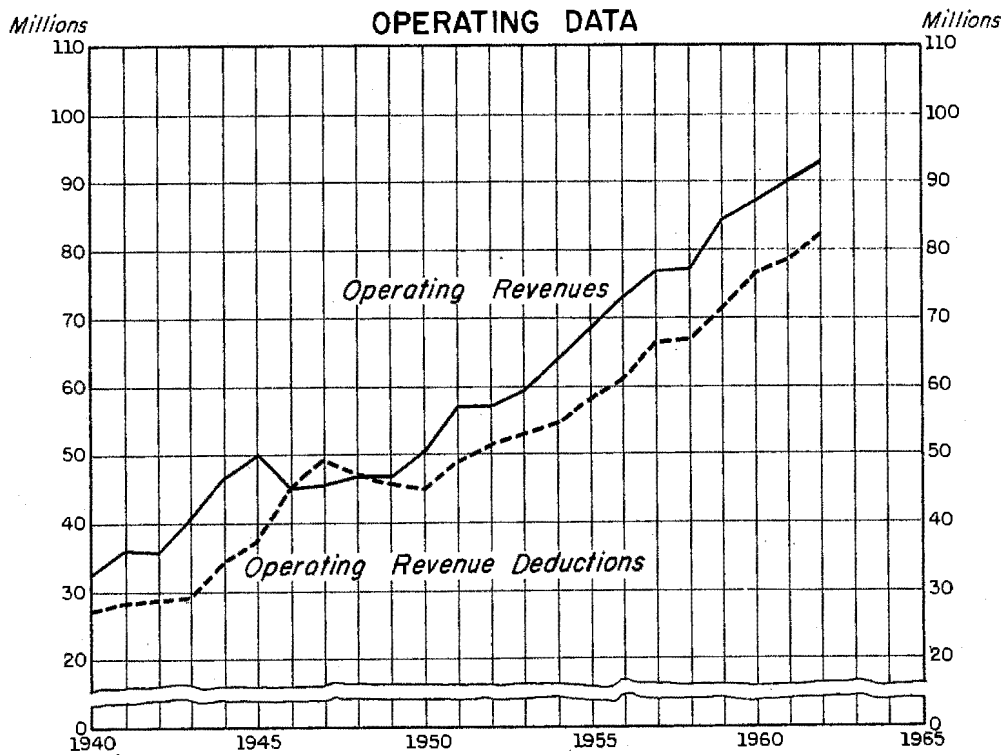
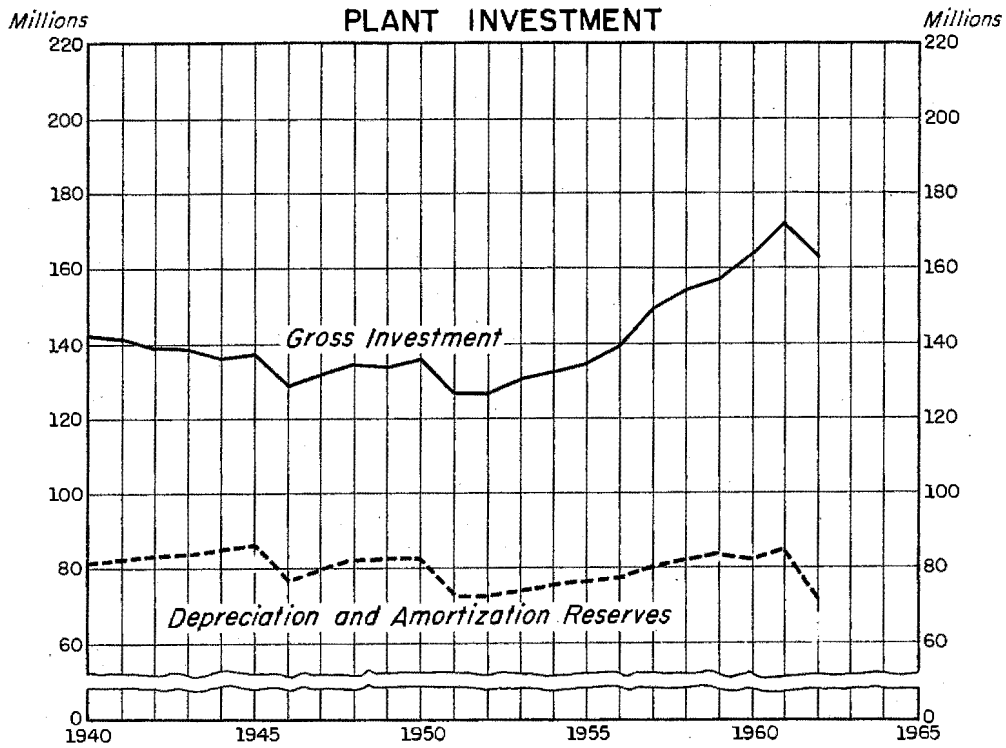

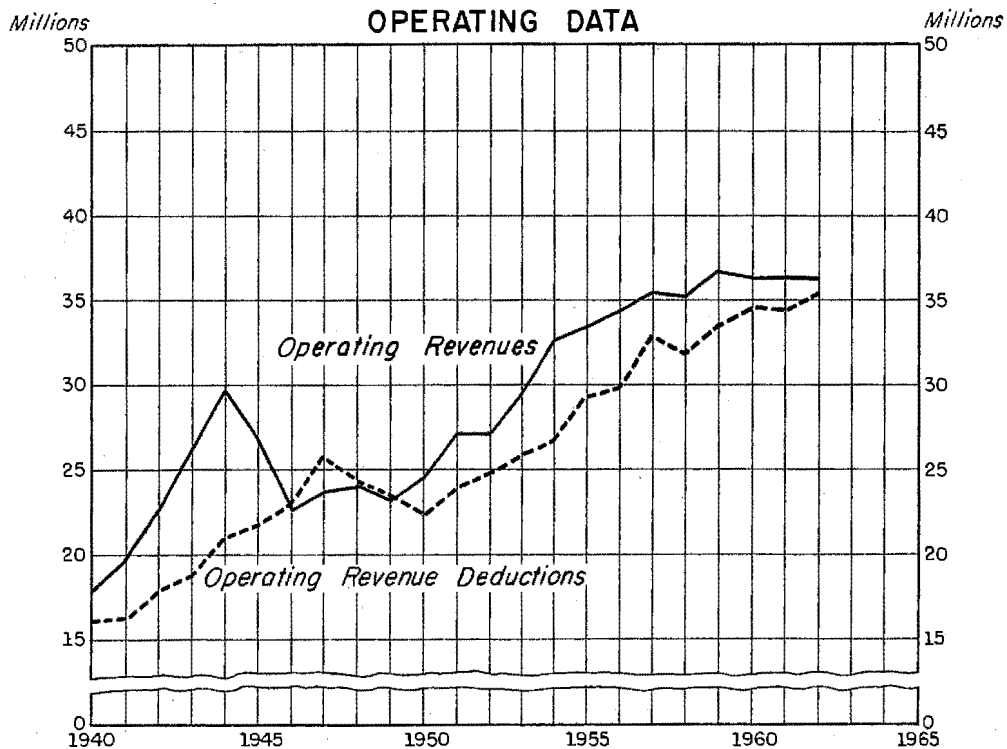
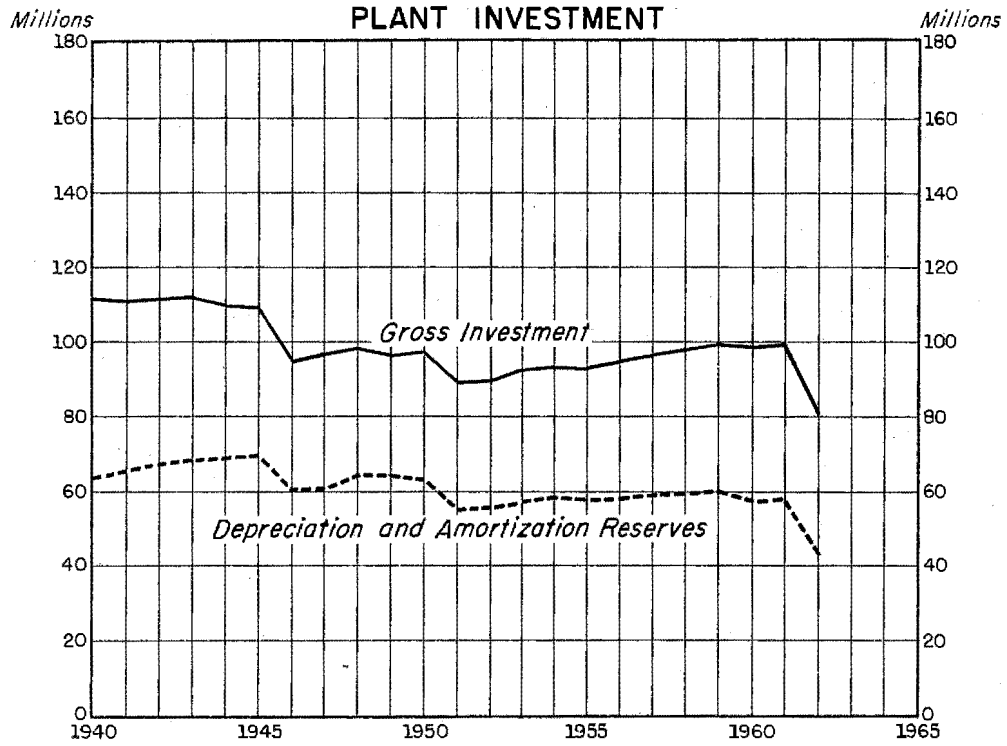
DEVELOPMENT OF PRINCIPAL DOMESTIC TELEGRAPH CARRIERS 1940-1962



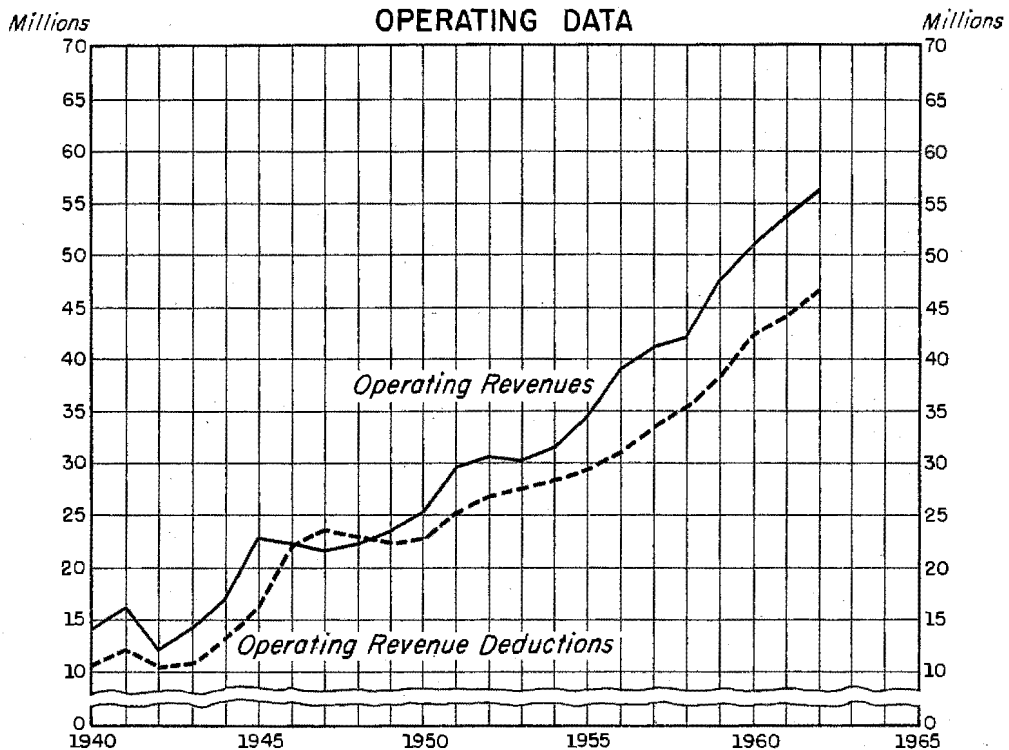
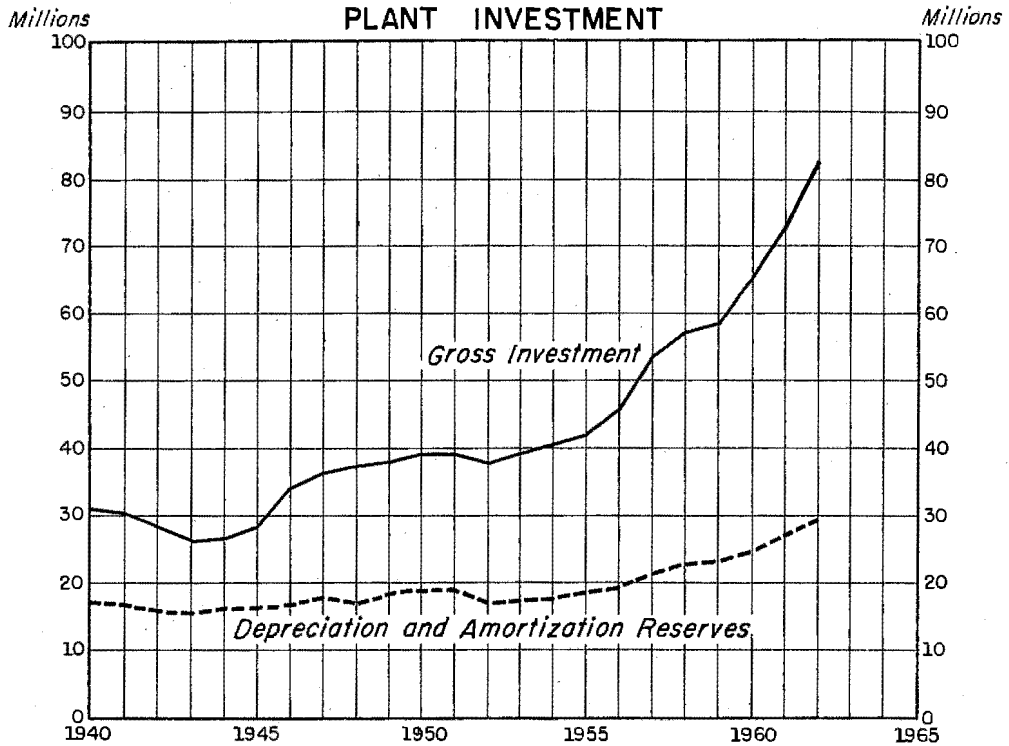
DEVELOPMENT OF PRINCIPAL INTERNATIONAL TELEGRAPH CARRIERS 1940-1962
