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INTRODUCTION

This volume contains financial and operating data for the year 1946 compiled chiefly from annual reports filed with the Federal Communications Commission. Section A is compiled from the reports of telephone, wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radio-telegraph carriers, including reports submitted by the controlling companies of such carriers. Section B is based on the annual reports of standard broadcast stations and networks.

This is the eighth successive year that this publication has been issued, the initial issue being for the year 1939. Before 1939, some of the statistics were printed in the Commission's Annual Reports to Congress and some were released in mimeographed form.

For additional explanation of the coverage of the statistics the reader is referred to the statements introducing Sections A and B.

SECTION A

COMMON CARRIERS AND CONTROLLING COMPANIES

Only common carriers engaged in rendering interstate and foreign communication service are required to file annual and monthly reports with the Commission in accordance with the Communications Act of 1934. Virtually all wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radiotelegraph carriers are subject to the full jurisdiction of the Commission. A large number of telephone carriers, mostly rural lines engaged in intrastate service, are not fully subject to the Act, and are not required to file reports. A few of the larger intrastate telephone carriers, however, voluntarily file annual reports and a considerable number file monthly reports for statistical purposes. It is estimated that the telephone carriers reporting annually account for approximately 95% of the gross operating revenues of all telephone carriers in the United States.

Annual reports from common carriers. — The majority of the items of outstanding interest in the annual reports are shown in this publication in summary form and by individual companies. Detailed data are shown for telephone carriers having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$100,000, and for wire-telegraph, ocean-cable and radiotelegraph carriers having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000. The smaller carriers submit less comprehensive reports, and only a limited amount of information is shown for them. Bell System figures are shown separately, inasmuch as the major portion of the telephone business in the United States is done by that group of companies. Certain intercompany duplications are eliminated in the tables so that the net results represent data for all large telephone companies filing annual reports with the Commission considered as one system.

Monthly reports from common carriers. -- A few tables showing operating data compiled from the monthly reports of common carriers are included in this volume. Telephone carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$250,000, and wire-telegraph, ocean-cable and radiotelegraph carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000 file monthly reports with the Commission. In view of the fact that numerous intrastate telephone carriers file on a monthly but not on an annual basis, the cumulative monthly figures for telephone carriers are slightly larger than the figures shown for the carriers which file annual reports.

Companies controlling common carriers. -- Some selected financial items tabulated from the annual reports of holding companies are shown in this publication. The intercorporate relations between carriers engaged in rendering communication service and the controlling companies are also indicated. Holding companies filing annual reports with the Commission are classified into two groups, as follows: (a) Companies whose interest in common carriers constitutes a major portion of their assets, and (b) Companies whose interest in common carriers constitutes only a nominal portion of their assets.

Revisions in data presentation. -- To assist the user of the statistics various changes have been introduced in the present volume affecting the form and content of the tables. In addition, data are presented for the first time on the seasonally adjusted revenues of the wire-telegraph (page 146 table 41) and the telephone carriers (page 30 table 18).

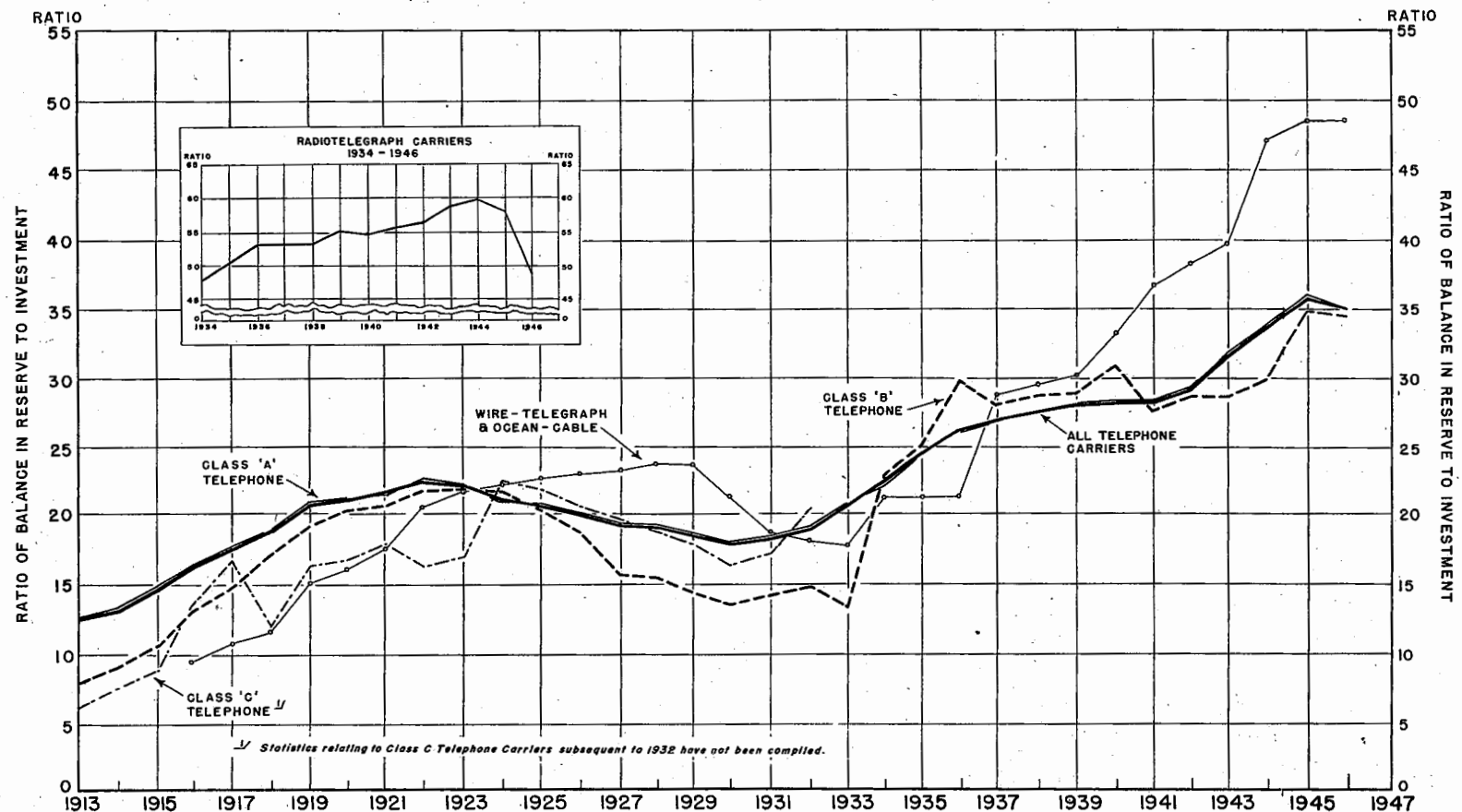

Note.--The difference in the number of carriers reporting to the Commission in 1946 in comparison with prior years is caused by mergers, consolidations, reclassifications, etc.

Data for 1926-1943 include information for carriers reporting as class A in 1943. These data also cover properties acquired previous to 1943 by such carriers. Carriers which reported as class A carriers in 1944, 1945 or 1946 but not in 1943 are reflected in the data for 1944-1946 only. Neither information for these companies nor for properties acquired by them previous to 1944 are included in the data for the years 1926-1943.

The effect of this change of definition is extremely slight. For example, operating revenues of class A carriers reporting in 1946 not so characterized in 1943 had operating revenues which were only 0.006 percent of total operating revenues reported.

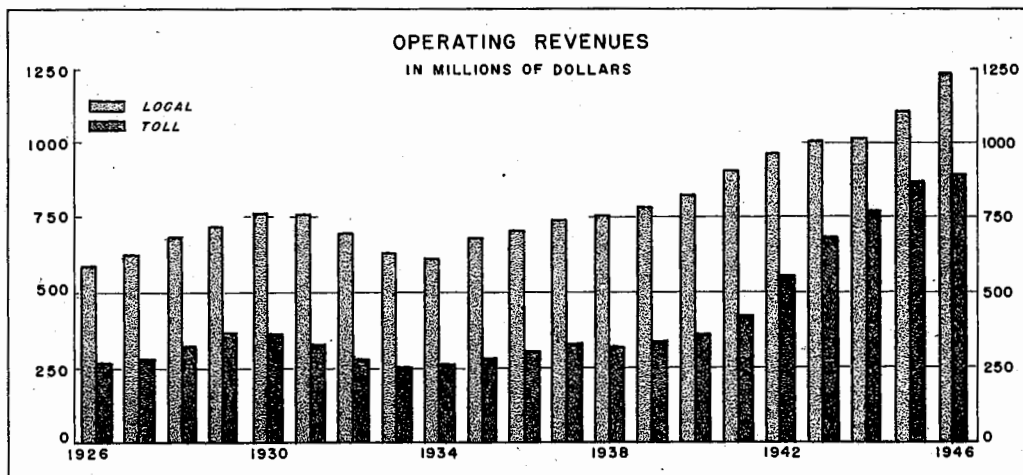
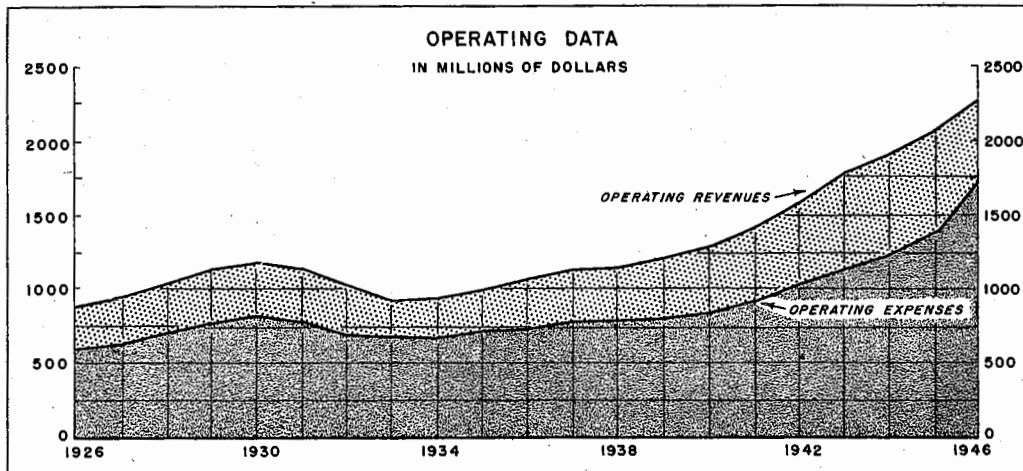
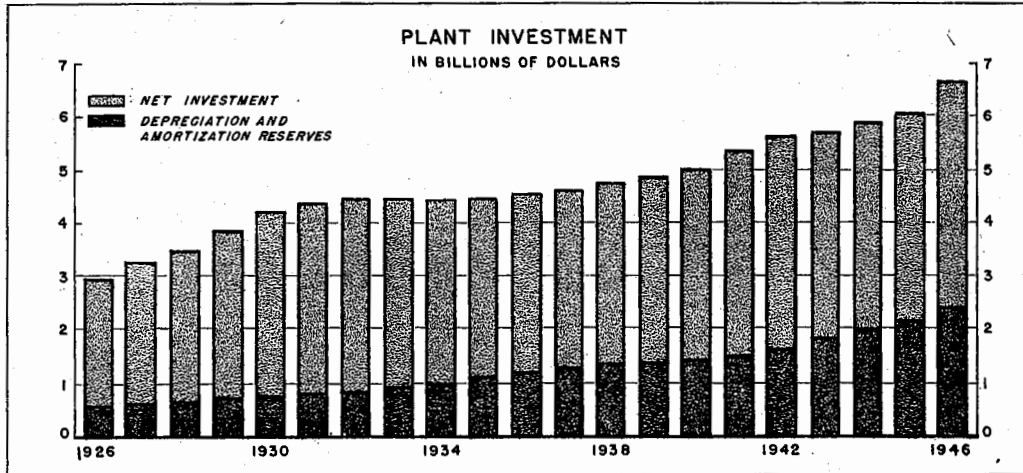

CLASS A TELEPHONE CARRIERS

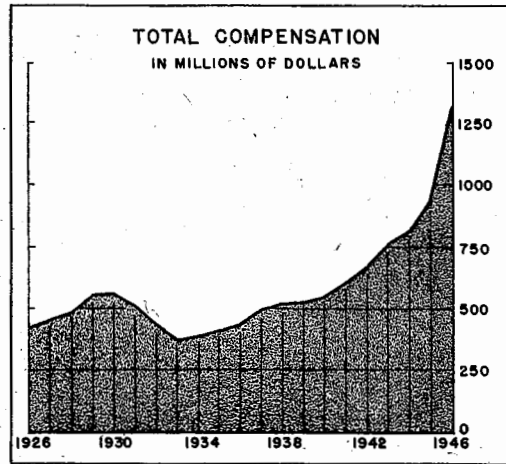
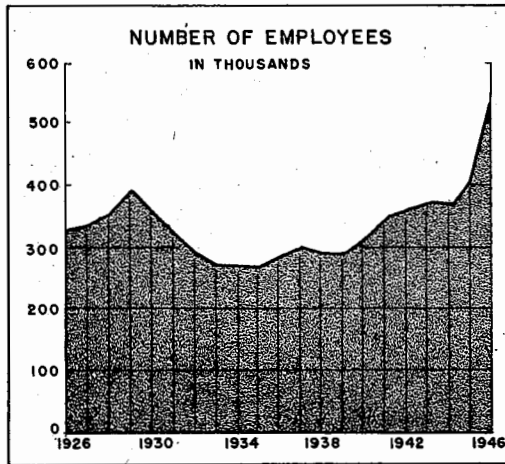
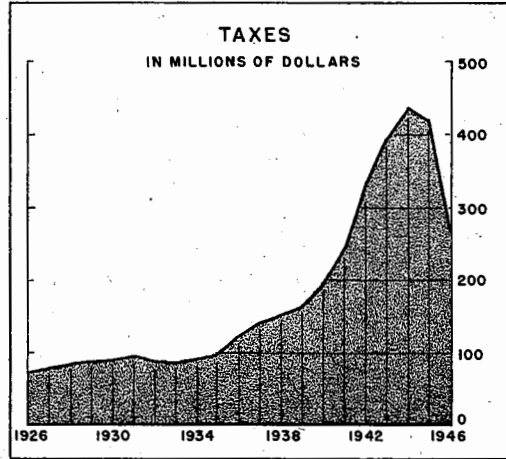
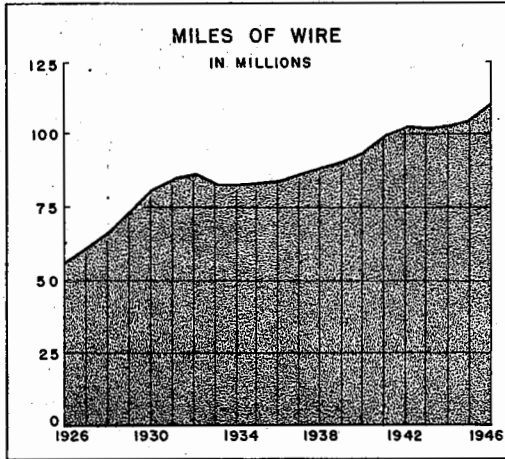
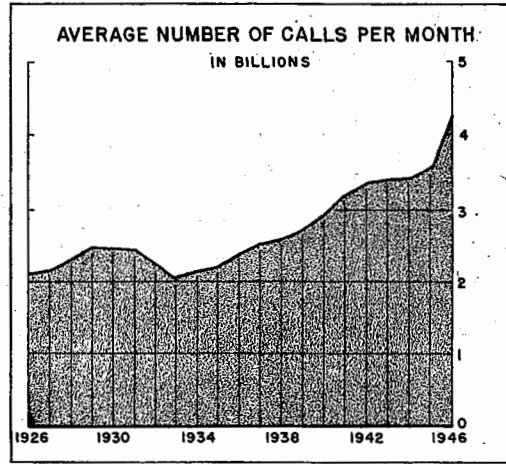
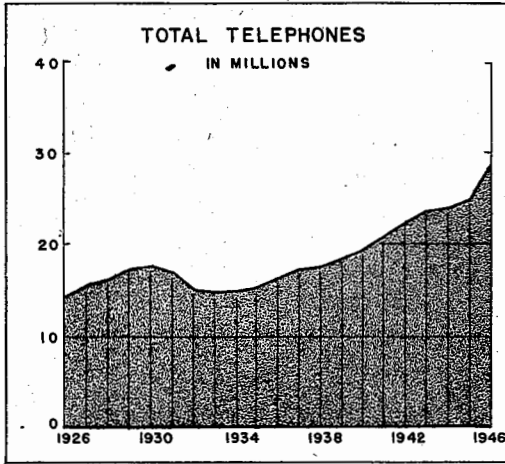

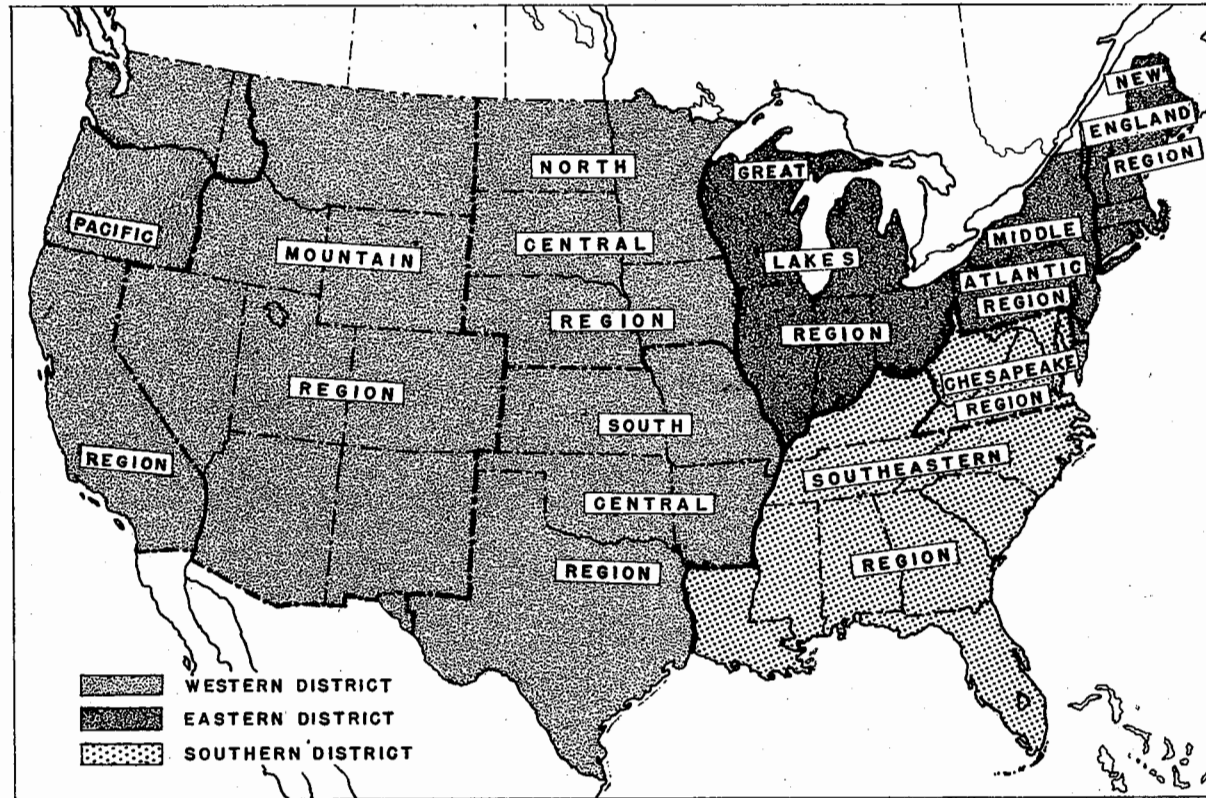

SECTION B

**Financial and Operating Data Relative to
Standard Broadcast Stations and Networks**

STANDARD BROADCAST STATIONS AND NETWORKS

Section B contains financial and employee data concerning the operations of 1025 standard (AM) broadcast stations, 4 nation-wide networks and 4 regional networks during the calendar year 1946.

Many revisions have been made in the content and presentation of the data this year in accordance with a general program to improve the usefulness of the statistics. Of particular note are tables presenting profitability ratios which are made available in the volume for the first time. Two ratios of profitability are used: The ratio of broadcast income (before Federal income tax) to depreciated cost of tangible broadcast property,^{1/} and the ratio of broadcast expenses to broadcast revenues. (See tables 28 and 30).

Geographical groupings. — The standard broadcast stations, which are included in the tabulations, have been grouped geographically into seven regions, as follows:

Northeastern region. — Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont.

Great Lakes region. — Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

Midwest region. — Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.

Southeastern region. — Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia.

South Central region. — Oklahoma and Texas.

Mountain region. — Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming.

Pacific region. — California, Oregon, and Washington.

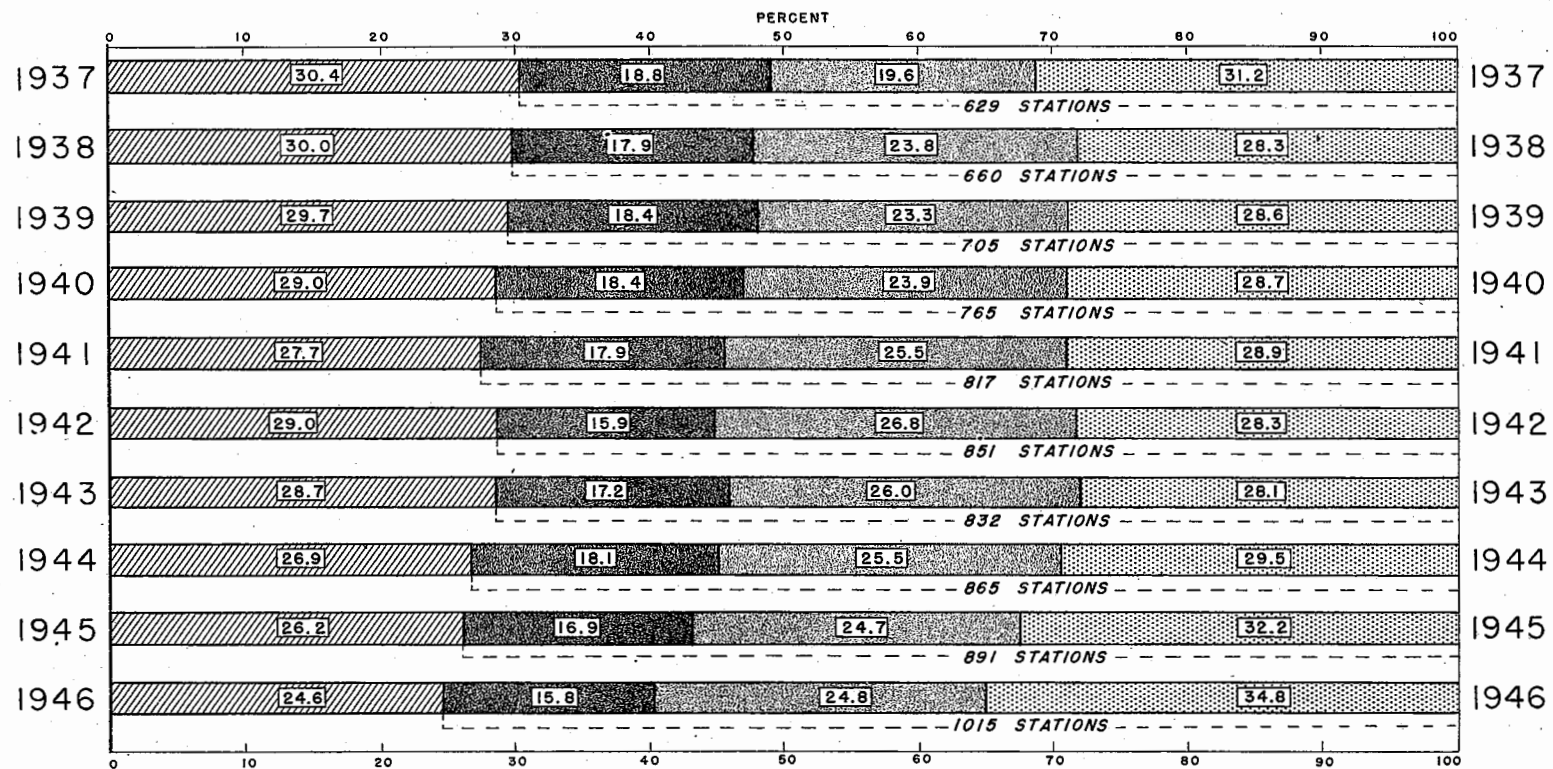

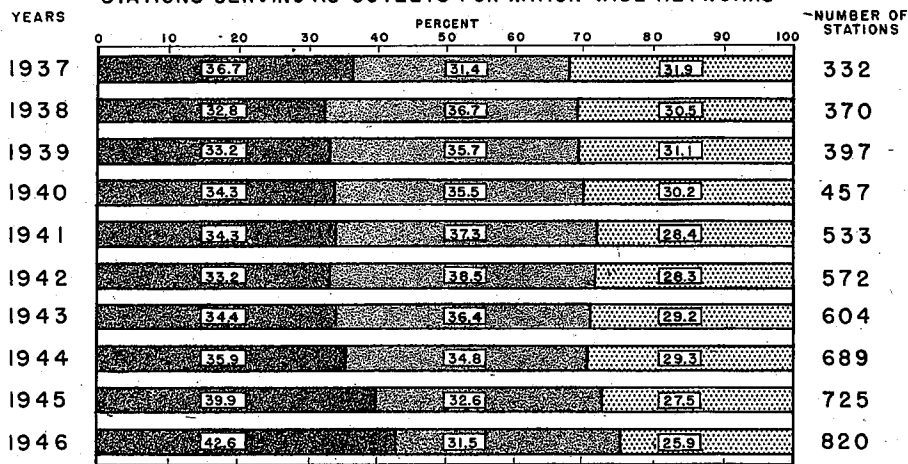

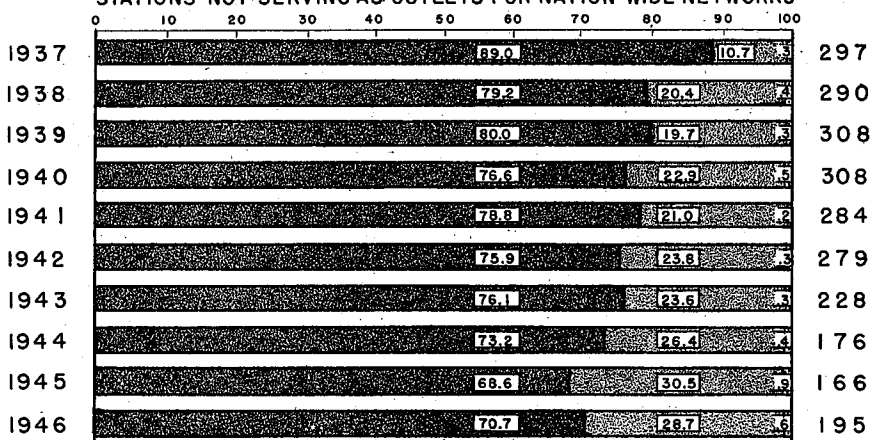

1937-1946

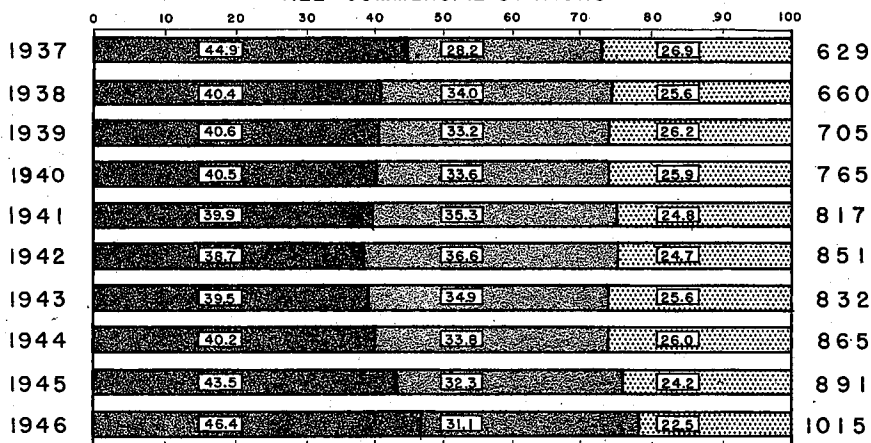
STATIONS SERVING AS OUTLETS FOR NATION-WIDE NETWORKS
