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INTRODUCTION

General remarks. -- This volume contains financial and operating data for the year 1945 compiled chiefly from annual reports filed with the Federal Communications Commission by telephone, wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radiotelegraph carriers, including reports submitted by the controlling companies of such carriers, also data taken from reports of standard broadcast stations and networks.

This is the seventh successive year that this publication has been issued, the initial issue being for the year 1939. It makes available a uniform presentation of comprehensive information on the communications industry. Before 1939, some of the statistics were printed in the Commission's Annual Reports to Congress and some were released through various mimeographed reports.

Jurisdiction over common carriers. -- According to the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, only those communication carriers engaged in interstate or foreign communication service are subject to the full jurisdiction of the Commission and are required to file annual and monthly reports. Practically all the wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radio-telegraph carriers are subject to the full jurisdiction of the Commission. There is a large number of telephone carriers, principally rural lines, engaged in intrastate service that are not subject fully to the Act and are not required to file reports. However, a few of the larger intrastate telephone carriers file annual reports and many of them file monthly reports voluntarily for statistical purposes. It is estimated that on the basis of plant investment and of operating revenues, the telephone carriers reporting annually represent approximately 95% of the telephone industry in the United States.

Annual reports of communication carriers. -- The more salient information contained in the annual reports is shown in this publication in summary form and by individual companies. Statistical data are shown in detail for telephone carriers having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$100,000 and for wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radiotelegraph carriers having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000. Only limited data are shown for the smaller carriers, as they submit less comprehensive reports.

Bell System. -- Since the major portion of the telephone business in the United States is done by the Bell System, the summaries of telephone statistics published in this volume show

Bell System data separately. The tables also show the elimination of certain intercompany duplications of financial and operating data, so that the net result represents data for all large telephone carriers filing annual reports with the Commission considered as one system.

Monthly reports of communication carriers. -- Several summaries showing statistics compiled from monthly reports from communication carriers are contained in this volume. Monthly reports are filed by telephone carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$250,000 and by wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radiotelegraph carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000. Owing to the difference in coverage, the cumulative monthly figures of telephone carriers for the year do not agree with the annual report figures, the former being slightly larger due to the fact that many intrastate carriers file monthly but not annual reports.

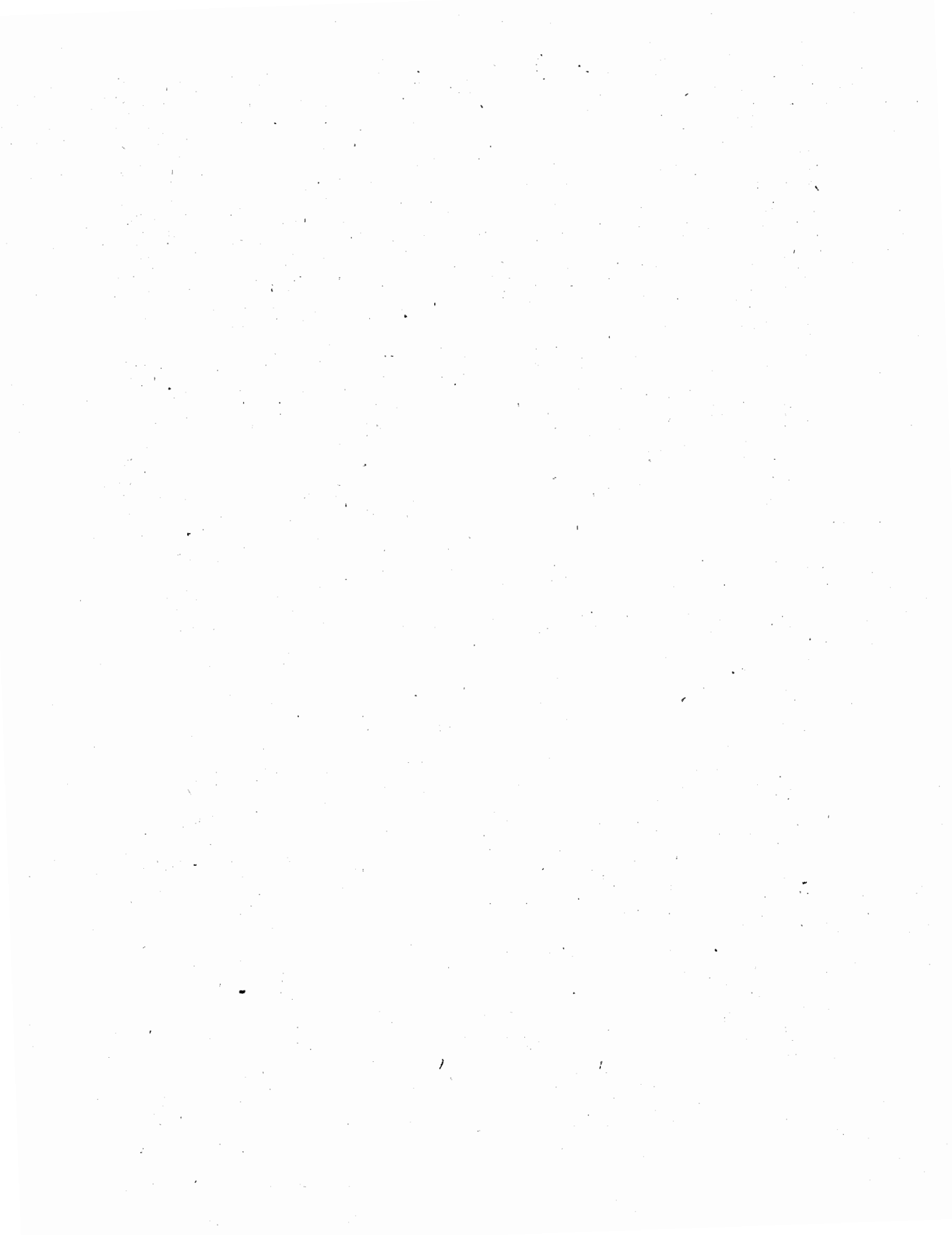
Holding companies. -- The companies which directly control communication carriers subject to the act are required to file annual reports. Holding companies reporting to the Commission are divided into two classes, those having large interests in the communications industry and those having nominal interests. Tables containing selected financial items relating to individual holding companies appear in this publication, also a table showing the intercorporate relations between the carriers and the holding companies.

Broadcast stations and networks. -- According to the act persons engaged in radio broadcasting are not deemed to be common carriers. Inasmuch as the annual financial and operating reports of standard broadcast stations and networks are filed with the Commission on a confidential basis, they are not available to the public. Therefore, the statistical data compiled from the reports are shown in this volume in summary form and not by individual stations and networks.

Recent developments in communications. -- Numerous technical improvements in communications, both wire and radio, as a result of electronic research during the war years have greatly stimulated the demand for current statistical data relating to the industry. The information contained in this volume will be of timely interest and will be helpful to other organizations of the Government, and a wide range of organizations interested in communication problems in various sections of the United States and throughout the world.

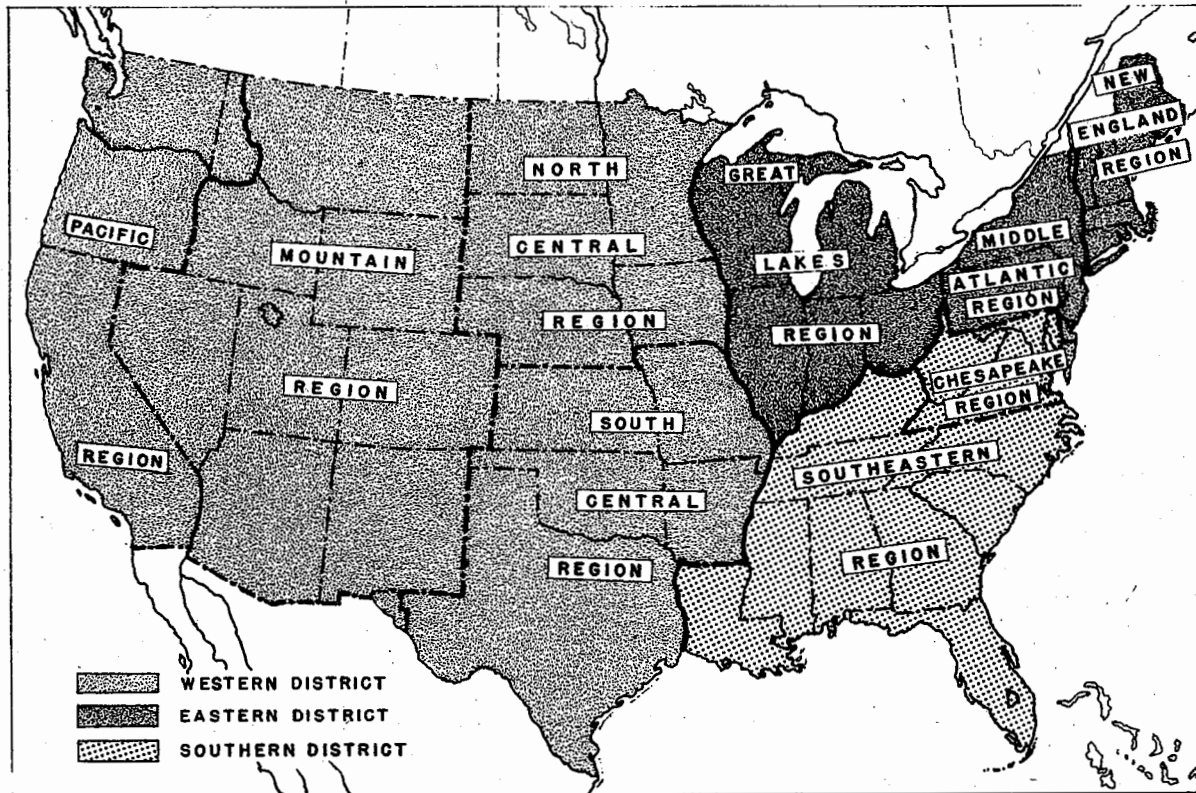

CLASS A TELEPHONE CARRIERS

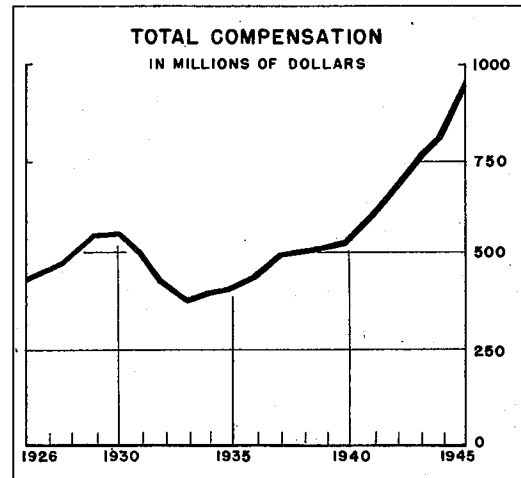
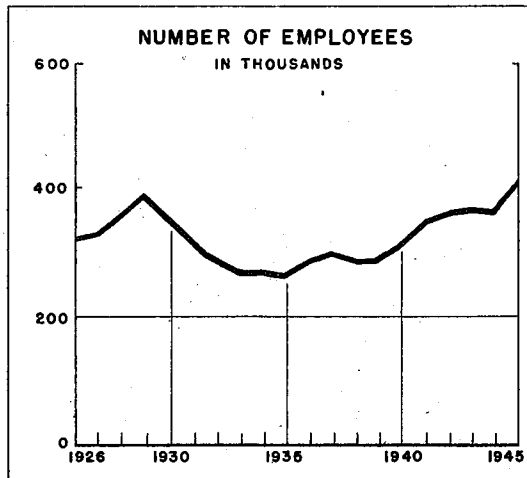

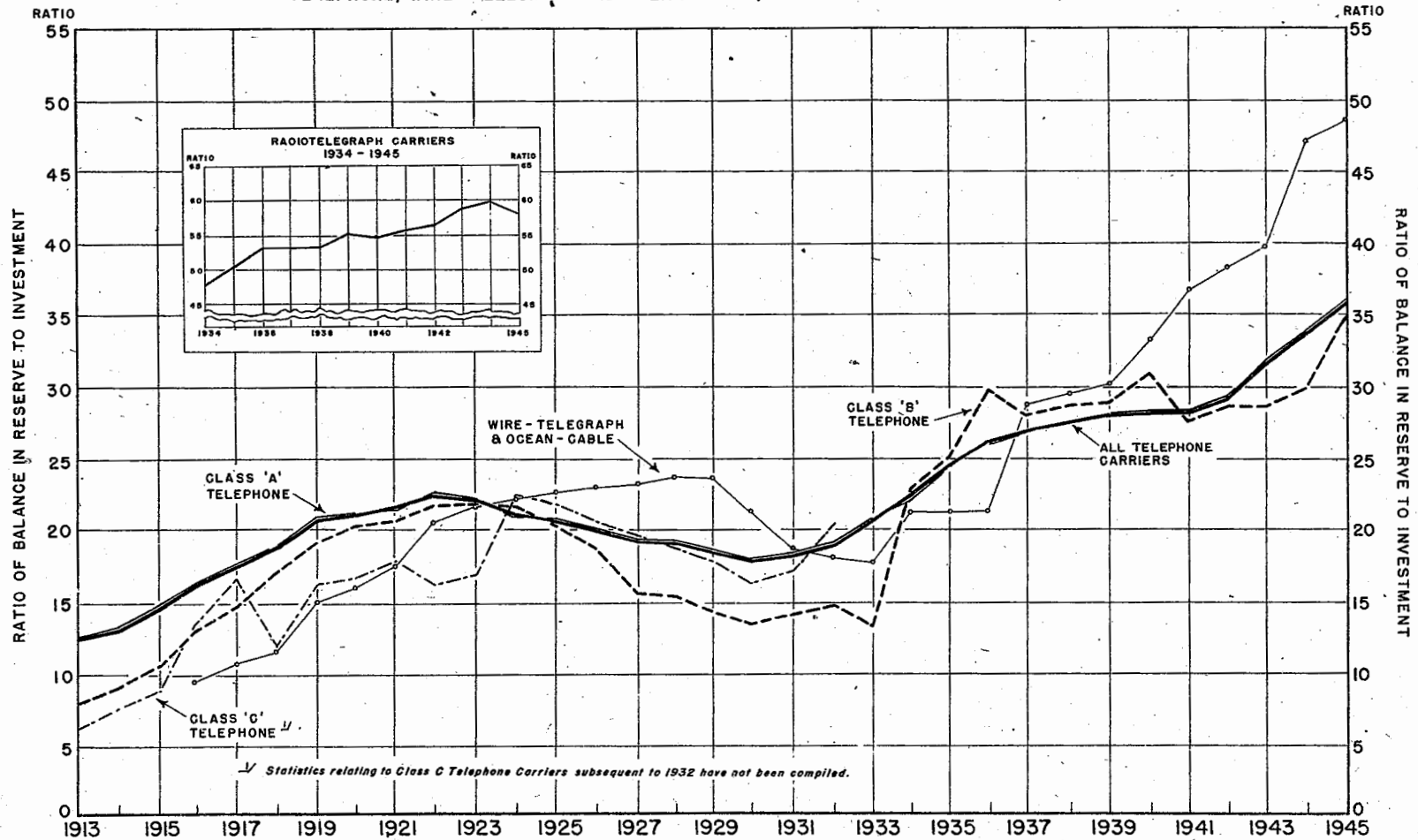

STANDARD BROADCAST STATIONS AND NETWORKS

General remarks.--Section B contains financial and operating data and information concerning the employees of 901 commercial broadcast stations, also of 4 nation-wide and 6 regional networks, for the calendar year 1945. The tables showing employee data by months are for 901 stations, while those showing functional employment and pay-roll data cover 876 stations. The information was compiled from reports filed by standard broadcast stations in accordance with the provisions of section 1.301 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, and from financial statements submitted by the networks in compliance with the Commission's request for data. The following table indicates the number of existing licenses for stations and permits for new construction as of December 31, 1945:

Geographical groupings.--The standard broadcast stations, which are included in the tabulations, have been grouped geographically into three districts for statistical purposes. These districts have been divided into seven regions, as follows:

Northeastern region.--Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont.

Great Lakes region.--Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

Midwest region.--Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.

Southeastern region.--Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia.

South Central region.--Oklahoma and Texas.

Mountain region.--Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming.

Pacific region.--California, Oregon, and Washington.

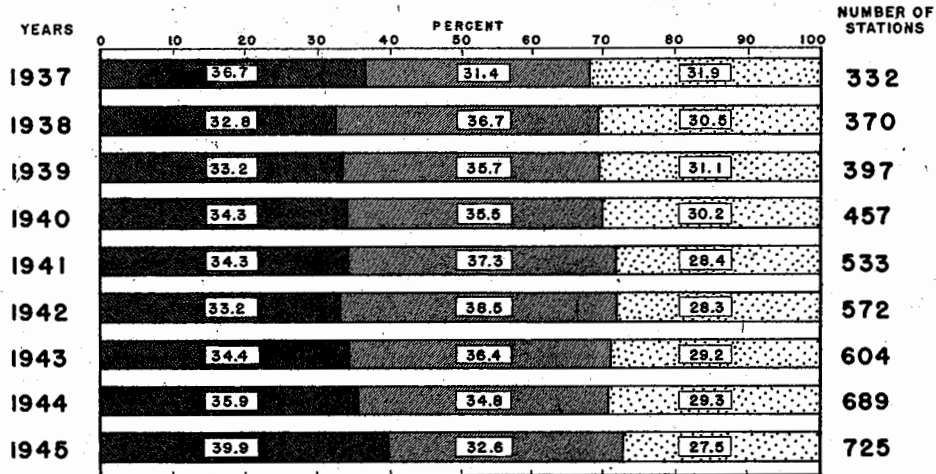

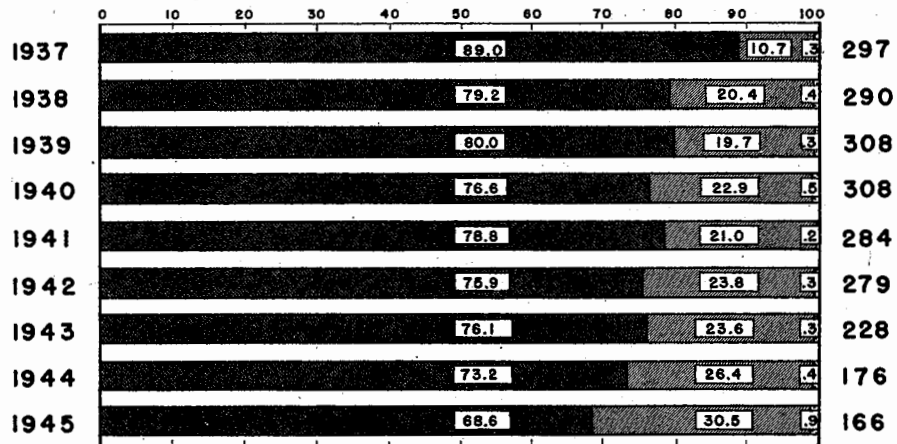

1937 - 1945**

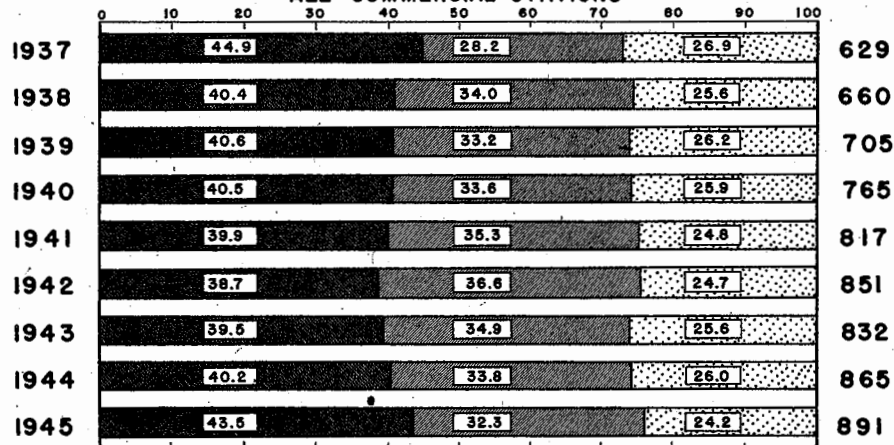
STATIONS SERVING AS OUTLETS FOR NATION-WIDE NETWORKS

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION OF REVENUES FROM TIME SALES OF STANDARD BROADCAST STATIONS

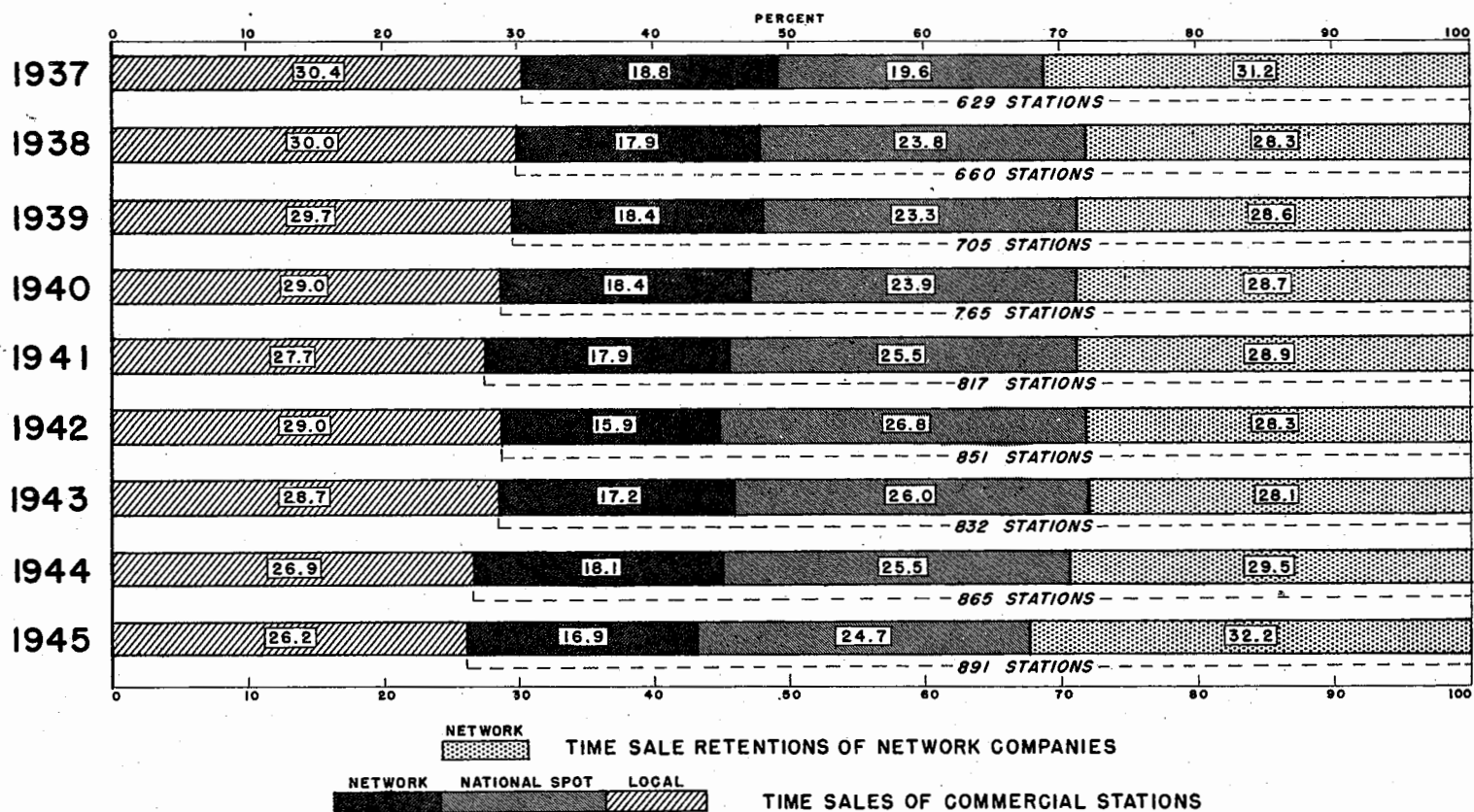
