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INTRODUCTION

General Remarks.—This volume contains financial and operating data for the calendar year 1942. Under the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934, the jurisdiction of the Commission extends to telephone, telegraph, cable and radiotelegraph carriers that render interstate and foreign service, and includes controlling companies and standard broadcast stations and networks.

The regulatory functions of the Commission relating to common carriers embrace charges, practices, and classifications; prevention of discrimination; approval of applications for new construction, extensions and improvements; reorganizations and mergers; passing on intercorporate directorates; also prescribing accounting regulations and instructions for the preparation and filing of annual and monthly reports. The regulatory activities of the Commission pertaining to broadcast stations primarily embrace the licensing of stations, the allocation of frequencies, renewal of licenses, and determining the financial qualifications of applicants, which involve special studies and engineering research.

Annual Reports from Common Carriers.—The detailed data applicable to individual companies are shown in this volume for telephone carriers having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$100,000 and for wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radiotelegraph carriers having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000. The smaller carriers submit less comprehensive annual reports, and only limited data for them are included in the publication.

In addition to the telephone carriers that are required by the act to file annual reports, there are five telephone carriers chiefly engaged in rendering intrastate service which file annual reports voluntarily for statistical purposes, and the data are included in the tables in this publication. These five carriers are subject only to sections 201-205 of the act, which require the filing of schedules of charges for interstate services.

Since the major portion of the telephone business in the United States is done by the Bell System, the summaries of telephone statistics show Bell System data separately. For the first time this issue of the year book shows elimination of certain intercompany items of telephone operating and financial data, so that the net result represents data for all telephone carriers regarded as one system.

Monthly Reports from Common Carriers.—Telephone carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$250,000 and wire-telegraph, ocean-cable, and radiotelegraph carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000 are required to file monthly reports of revenues and expenses. The data are compiled from these reports and shown by months in tables in this publication.

Besides the carriers that are required to file monthly reports in accordance with the act, there are 58 telephone carriers and one wire-telegraph carrier engaged primarily in intrastate service and subject only to sections 201-205 of the act, that file monthly reports voluntarily for statistical purposes. Accordingly, the cumulative monthly figures for the year are slightly higher than the figures shown for the carriers which file annual reports.

Holding Companies.—The companies which control communications carriers are required to file annual reports with the Commission in accordance with the provisions of section 219 of the act. They are divided into two classes, those having large interests in the communications industry and those having nominal interests. Tables showing selected financial items concerning holding companies appear in this publication. There is included also a table setting forth the intercorporate relations between the carriers and the holding companies.

Broadcast Stations and Networks.—According to the act persons engaged in radio broadcasting are not deemed to be common carriers. Annual financial and operating reports are filed by standard broadcast stations and networks for the confidential information of the Commission and are not available to the public. The statistical data contained in this yearbook are therefore shown in summary form and not by individual stations and networks.

Communication Industry and Relation to War.—An efficient communication system is of vital importance in bringing the war to a successful conclusion. Numerous requests are received from war agencies of the Government and from the public for information contained in this publication and for supplemental data concerning the communications industry.

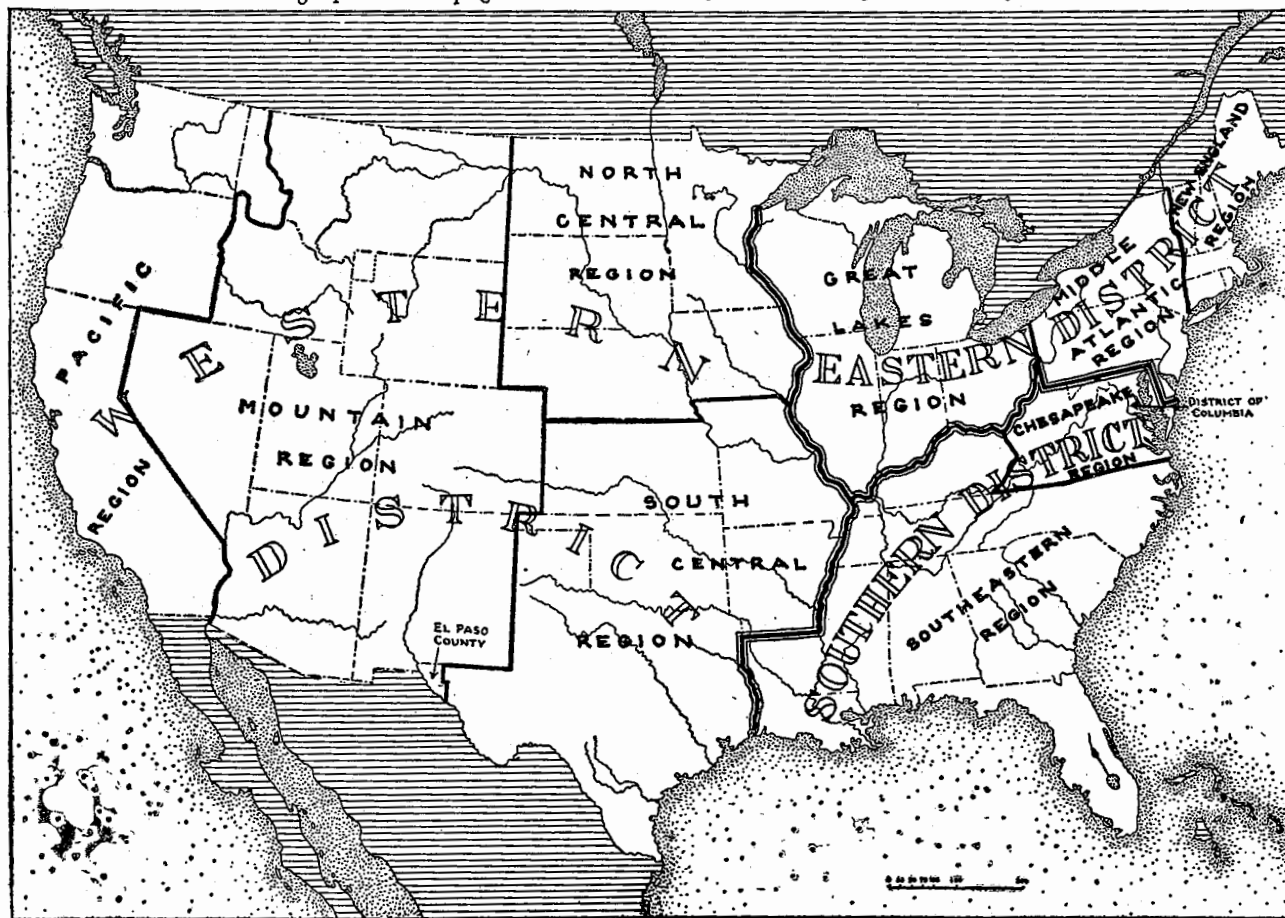

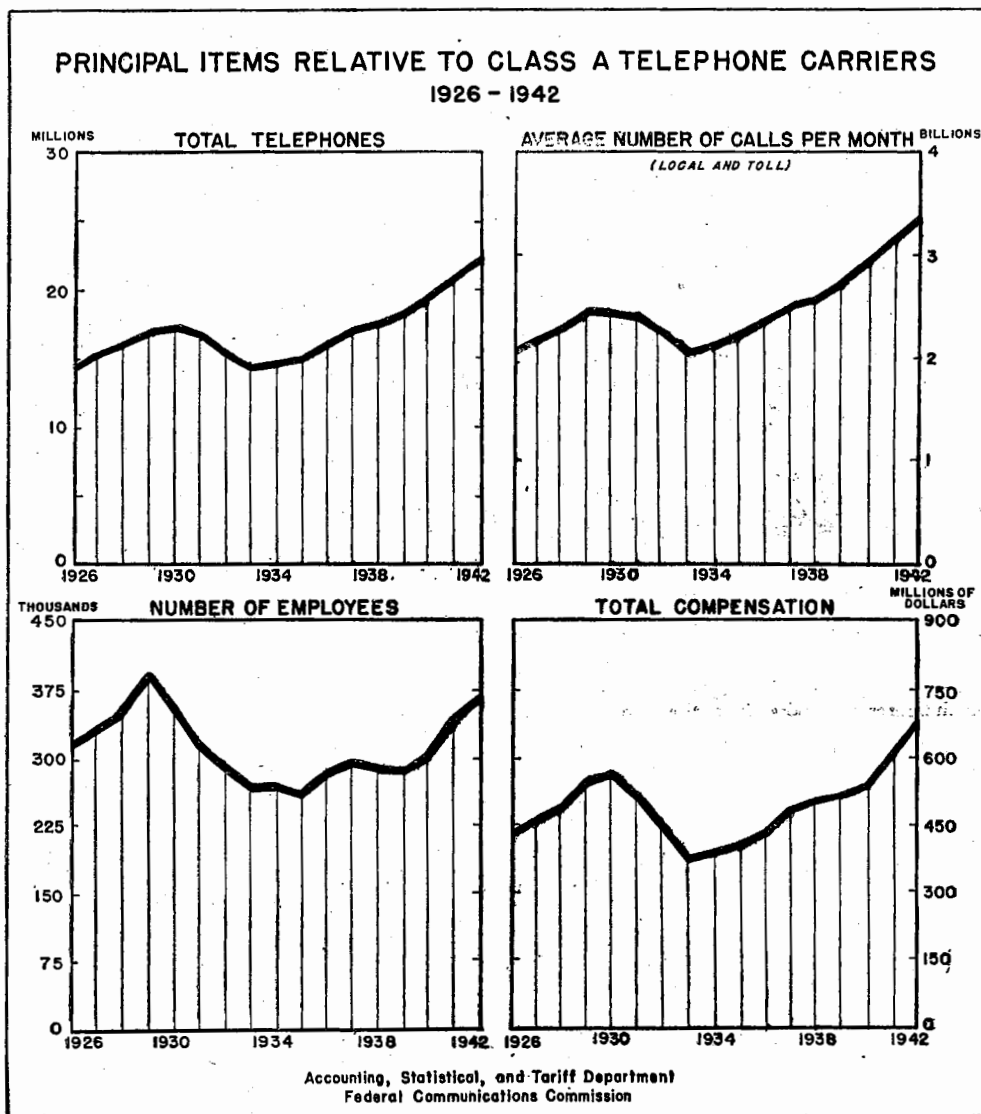

NOTE.—The Bell System financial statements shown here consolidate the accounts of the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. and its principal telephone subsidiaries listed hereunder. The subsidiaries so consolidated comprise all telephone companies having total assets in excess of \$1,000,000 each in which the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. has a majority interest, i.e., in which it owns, directly or indirectly securities representing more than 50% of the voting power. The proportionate interest of the companies consolidated in majority-owned subsidiaries not consolidated, including Western Electric Co., Inc., is included in the consolidated balance sheet in the aggregate of the equities applicable thereto as computed from the accounts of these subsidiaries and the proportionate interest in their earnings for the year is included in "other income" in the consolidated income statement.

The companies consolidated have for many years maintained their accounts in accordance with uniform system of accounts prescribed for telephone companies by Federal authorities. The system of accounts now in use was prescribed by the Federal Communications Commission, effective January 1, 1937.

Telephone plant is shown in the consolidated balance sheet in the aggregate of the amounts at which it is carried in the accounts of the individual companies consolidated. For the companies in the consolidated group, intercompany security holdings, intercompany receivables and payables, and intercompany items of income and expense, except minor items which cannot readily be identified, are excluded. In the elimination of intercompany security holdings, the difference between the aggregate cost of such securities to the companies owning them and the aggregate par or stated value of such securities has been applied to reduce the combined surplus accounts of the companies consolidated.

Most of the telephone equipment, apparatus and materials used by the companies consolidated has been manufactured or procured for them by Western Electric Co., Inc., under contracts providing that the prices paid shall be as low as Western Electric Co.'s prices to its most favored customers for like materials and services under comparable conditions. These items have been entered in the accounts of the telephone companies at cost to them and are included in these consolidated financial statements at such cost. This cost includes the return realized by Western Electric Co. on its investment devoted to this business.

In the course of rearranging operating territories or properties, there have been over the years, sales of plant between companies whose accounts are consolidated herein. Certain of these sales (relatively small in amount as compared with total plant) were made at prices which resulted at the time of sale in direct credits to the surplus accounts of the selling companies, but only such portions of these credits remain in consolidated surplus as have not been offset by charges for depreciation or amortization, or otherwise.

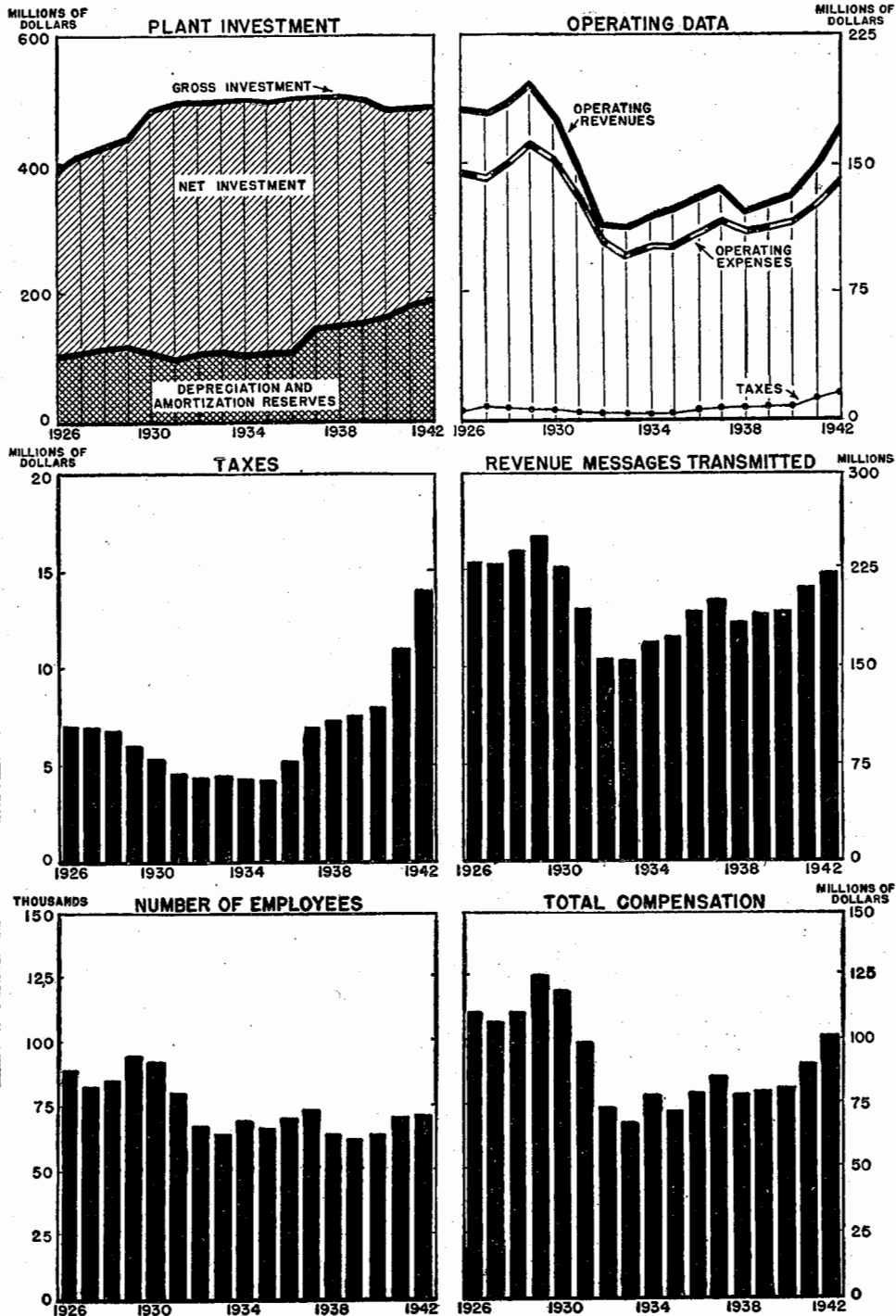

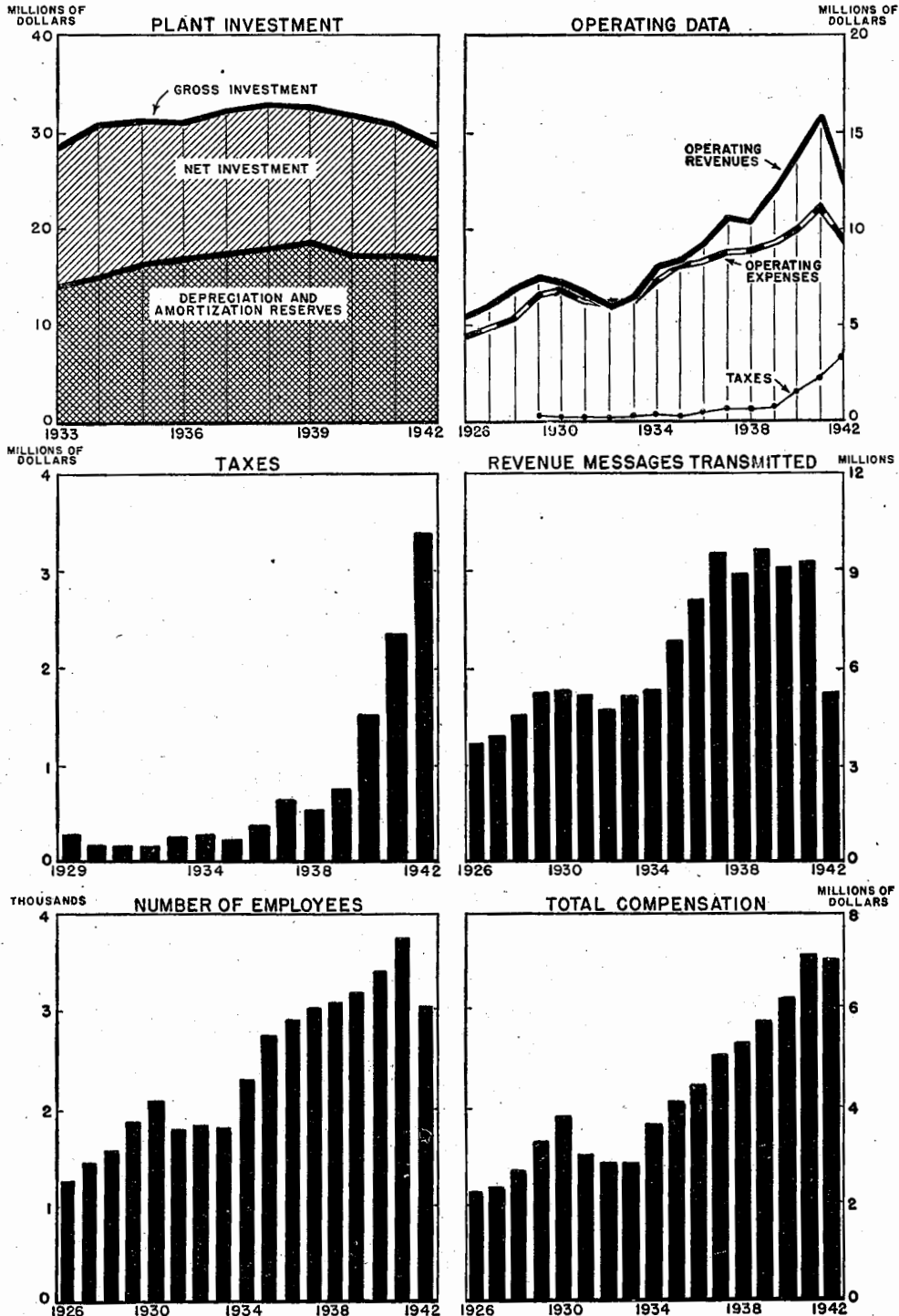

STANDARD BROADCAST STATIONS AND NETWORKS

General remarks.—The statistical data shown in section B pertain to the finances, operations, and employees of 851 commercial broadcast stations, also 4 major and 6 regional networks for the year 1942. The information was compiled from reports filed by standard broadcast stations in accordance with the provisions of section 1.361 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, and from statements submitted by the networks in compliance with the Commission's requests for data. The following table indicates the number of existing licenses for stations and permits for new construction as of December 31, 1942:

Midwest region.—Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT

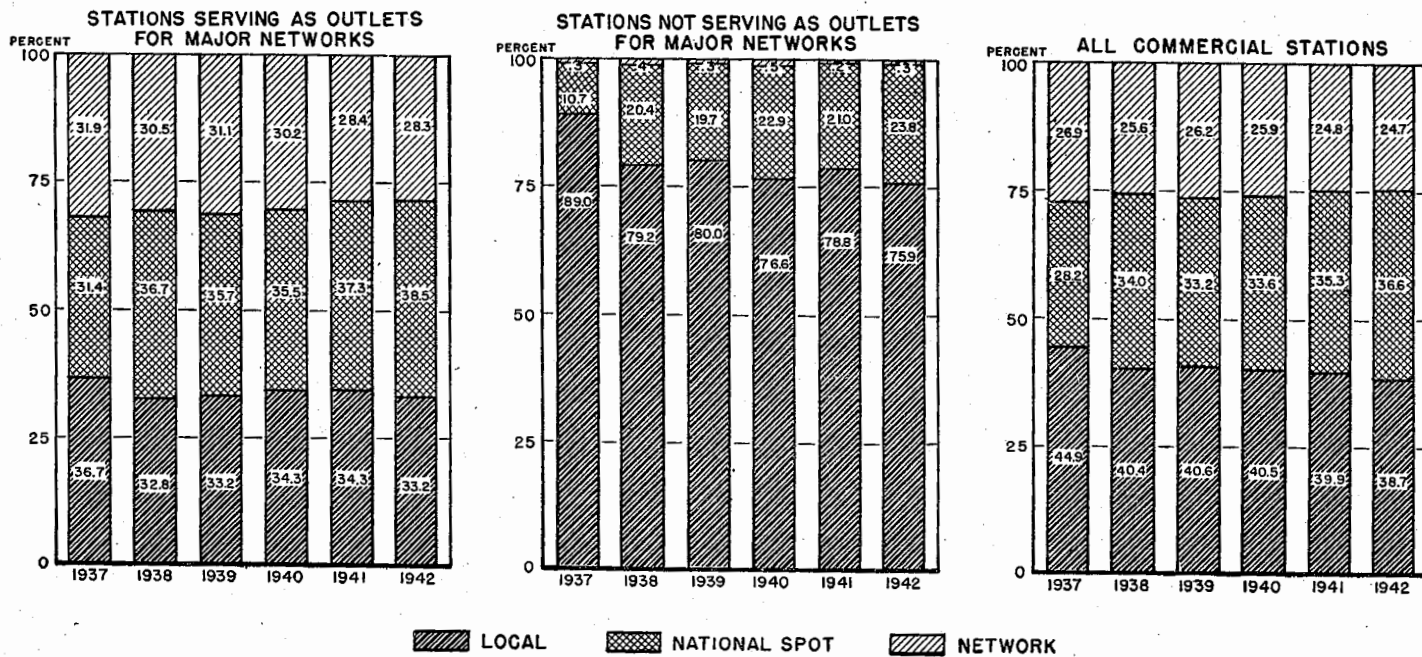

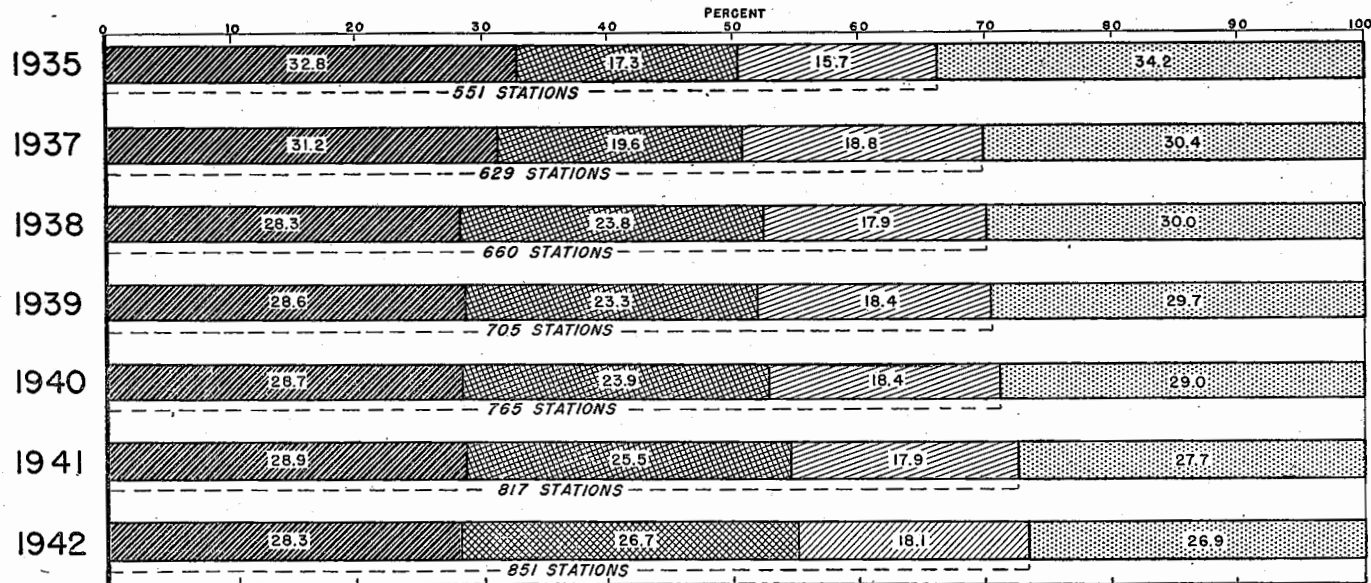
