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INTRODUCTION

General remarks.—The financial and operating data shown in this volume relate to the calendar year 1941. The Commission is authorized to regulate all wire and radio facilities under the provisions of the Communications Act of 1934. The jurisdiction extends to telephone, telegraph, cable, and radiotelegraph carriers and controlling companies which render interstate and international service; also to standard broadcast stations and networks. Carriers engaged primarily in intrastate service are not subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission except as to sections 201–205 of the act, which sections require the filing of schedules of charges for interstate service. According to the act, persons engaged in radio broadcasting are not deemed to be common carriers.

The regulation of common carriers embraces charges, practices, and classifications; prevention of discrimination; approval of applications for new construction, extensions, and improvements; reorganizations and mergers; passing on intercorporate directorates; also prescribing accounting regulations and instructions for the preparation and filing of annual and monthly reports. The regulation of broadcast stations embraces principally the licensing of the stations, the allocation of frequencies, renewal of licenses, determining the financial qualifications of applicants, and the conduct of special studies and engineering research.

Common carrier annual reports.—The statistical data shown in this volume were compiled principally from the annual reports filed by telephone, telegraph, cable, and radiotelegraph carriers subject to the full act and having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000. Carriers having average annual operating revenues of \$50,000 or less are required to file less comprehensive annual reports. The information pertaining to telephone carriers applies to those of classes A and B. Class A telephone carriers are those having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$100,000; class B telephone carriers are those having average annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000, but not more than \$100,000. A few of the communication carriers engaged primarily in intrastate service file annual reports, and their returns are included in the tables in this publication.

Common carrier monthly reports.—Monthly reports of revenues and expenses are filed by telephone carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$250,000 and by telegraph, cable, and radiotelegraph carriers having annual operating revenues exceeding \$50,000. The monthly operating data shown in the tables include returns from many carriers engaged primarily in rendering intrastate service, which voluntarily file monthly reports for statistical purposes.

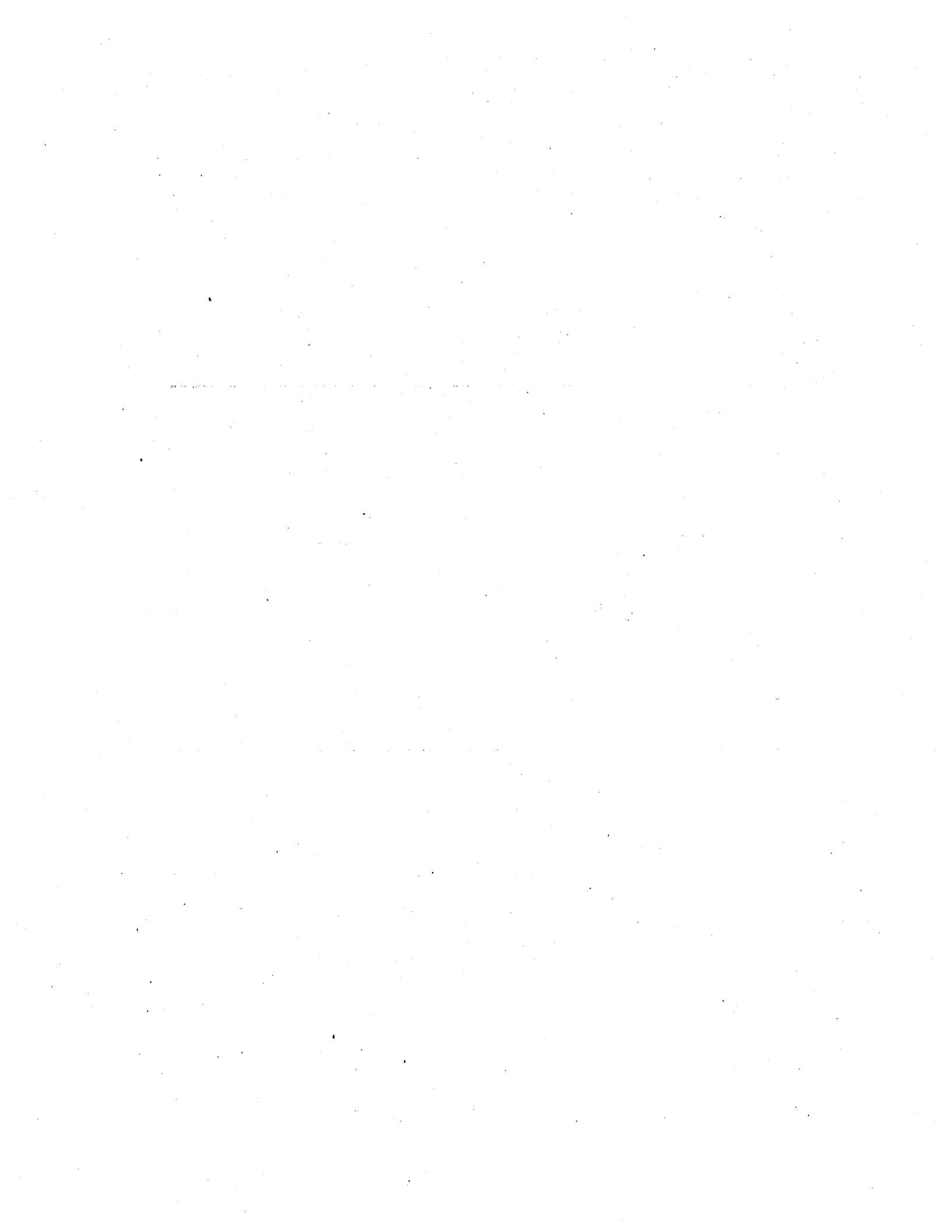
Broadcast stations and networks.—Since standard broadcast stations and networks are not considered common carriers, their annual financial and operating reports are not available to the public. Ac-

cordingly, statistical data relating to broadcasting are shown only in summary form in this yearbook, and not by individual stations and networks.

Communications industry and national defense.—There has been an increased demand for statistical data pertaining to the communications industry during the present national emergency. This is evidenced by the large sale of this publication and the many requests for supplemental data being received.

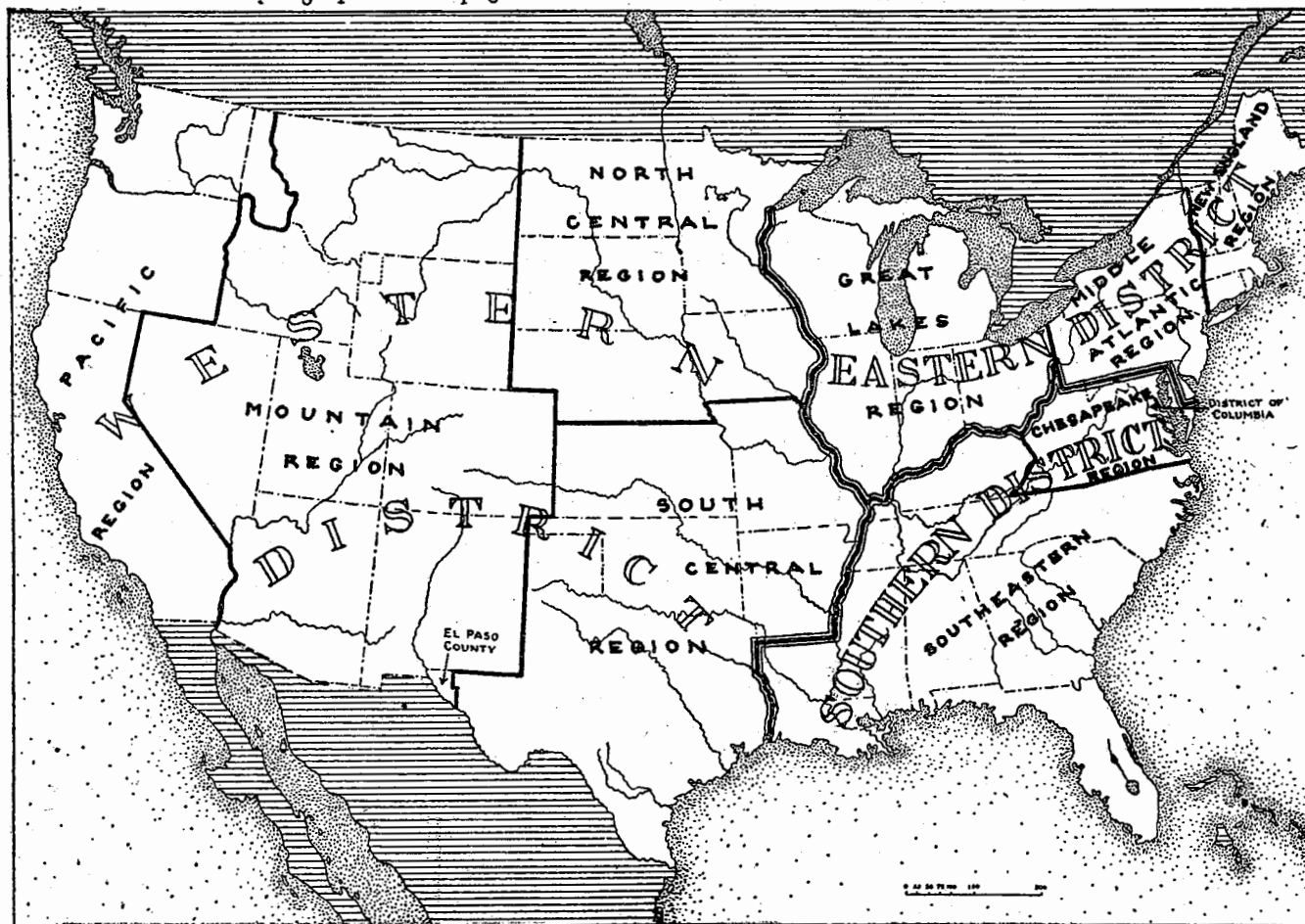

The companies consider that the latter amount resulting from an increase in accrual rates should properly have been included in operating expenses but, in view of questions now before the Federal Communications Commission as to the accounting for similar provision amounting to \$2,876,524 included in operating expenses since 1937 by seven of the companies consolidated, the additional amount of \$8,210,111, representing provision by companies consolidated other than the seven, was charged against income in 1941.

NOTE.—The Bell System financial statements shown here consolidate the accounts of the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. and its principal telephone subsidiaries listed hereunder. The subsidiaries so consolidated comprise all operating telephone companies having total assets in excess of \$1,000,000 each in which the American Telephone & Telegraph Co. owns, directly or indirectly, securities representing more than 50 percent of the voting power. The proportionate interest of the companies consolidated in subsidiaries not consolidated, including Western Electric Co., Inc., is included in the Consolidated Balance Sheet in the aggregate of the equities applicable thereto as computed from the accounts of these subsidiaries, and the proportionate interest in their earnings for the year is included in "Other income" in the consolidated income statement.

The companies consolidated have for many years maintained their accounts in accordance with uniform systems of accounts prescribed for telephone companies by Federal authorities. The system of accounts now in use was prescribed by the Federal Communications Commission, effective Jan. 1, 1937.

Telephone plant is shown in the consolidated balance sheet in the aggregate of the amounts at which it is carried in the accounts of the individual companies consolidated. For the companies in the consolidated group, intercompany security holdings, intercompany receivables and payables, and intercompany items of income and expense, except minor items which cannot readily be identified, are excluded. In the elimination of intercompany security holdings the difference between the aggregate cost of such securities to the companies owning them and the aggregate par or stated value of such securities has been applied to reduce the combined surplus accounts of the companies consolidated.

Most of the telephone equipment, apparatus, and materials used by the companies consolidated has been manufactured or procured for them by Western Electric Co., Inc., under contracts providing that the prices paid shall be as low as Western Electric Co.'s prices to its most favored customers for like materials and services under comparable conditions. These items have been entered in the accounts of the telephone companies at cost to them and are included in these consolidated financial statements at such cost. This cost includes the return realized by Western Electric Co. on its investment devoted to this business.

In the course of rearranging operating territories or properties there have been, over the years, sales of plant between companies whose accounts are consolidated herein. Certain of these sales (relatively small in amount as compared with total plant) were made at prices which resulted at the time of sale in direct credits to the surplus accounts of the selling companies, but only such portions of these credits as pertain to plant not yet retired or as have not otherwise been extinguished from the accounts remain in consolidated surplus.

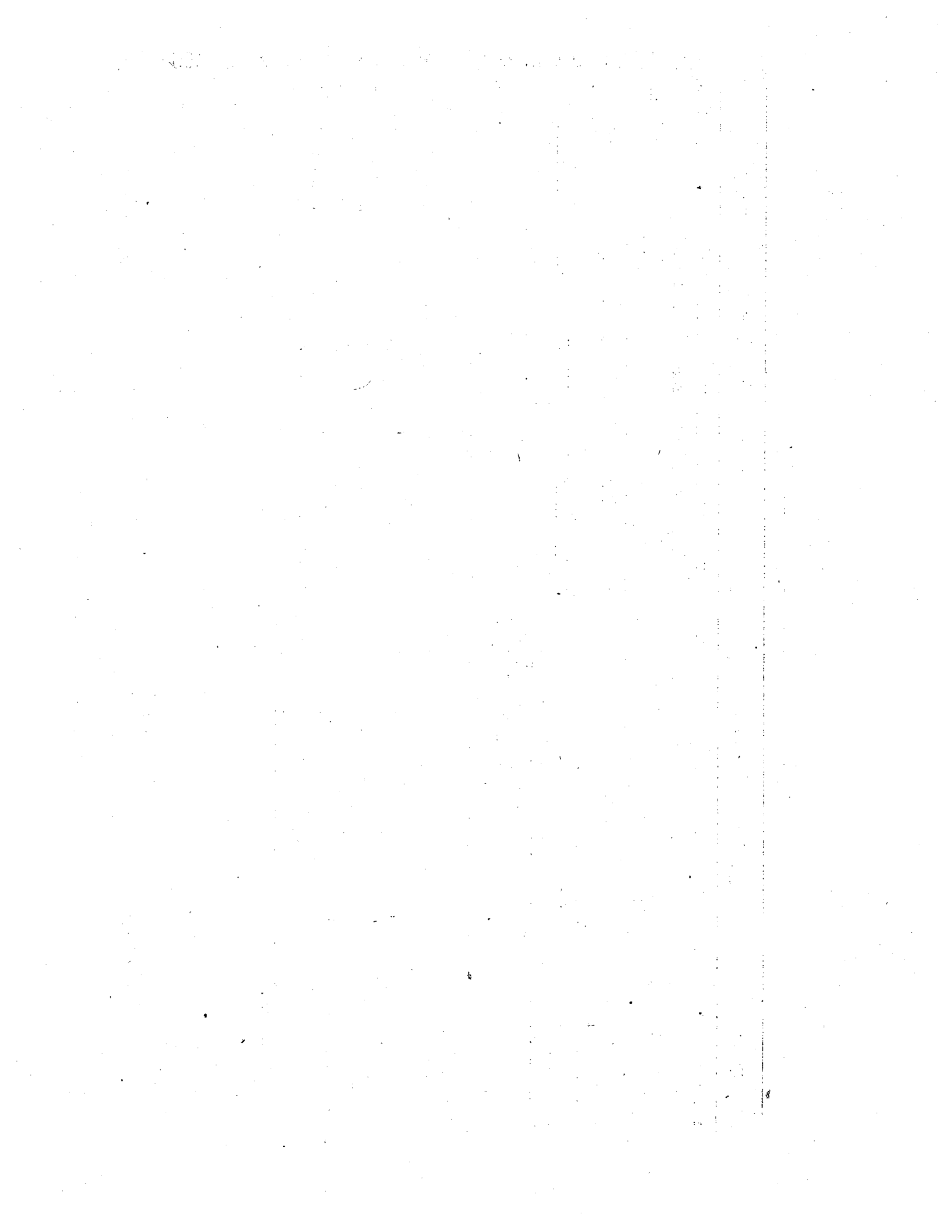

SECTION B

**Financial and Operating Data Relative to

STANDARD BROADCAST STATIONS AND NETWORKS

General remarks.—The statistical data shown in section B pertain to the finances, operations, and employees of 817 commercial broadcast stations, also 3 major and 7 regional networks for the year 1941. The information was compiled from reports filed by standard broadcast stations in accordance with the provisions of section 1.361 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, and from statements submitted by the networks in compliance with the Commission's requests for data. The following table indicates the number of existing licenses for stations and permits for new construction as of December 31, 1941:

NORTHERN DISTRICT

Northeastern region.—Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and Vermont.

Great Lakes region.—Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Ohio, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

Midwest region.—Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT

Southeastern region.—Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Virginia.

South Central region.—Oklahoma and Texas.

WESTERN DISTRICT

Mountain region.—Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Utah, and Wyoming.

Pacific region.—California, Oregon, and Washington.

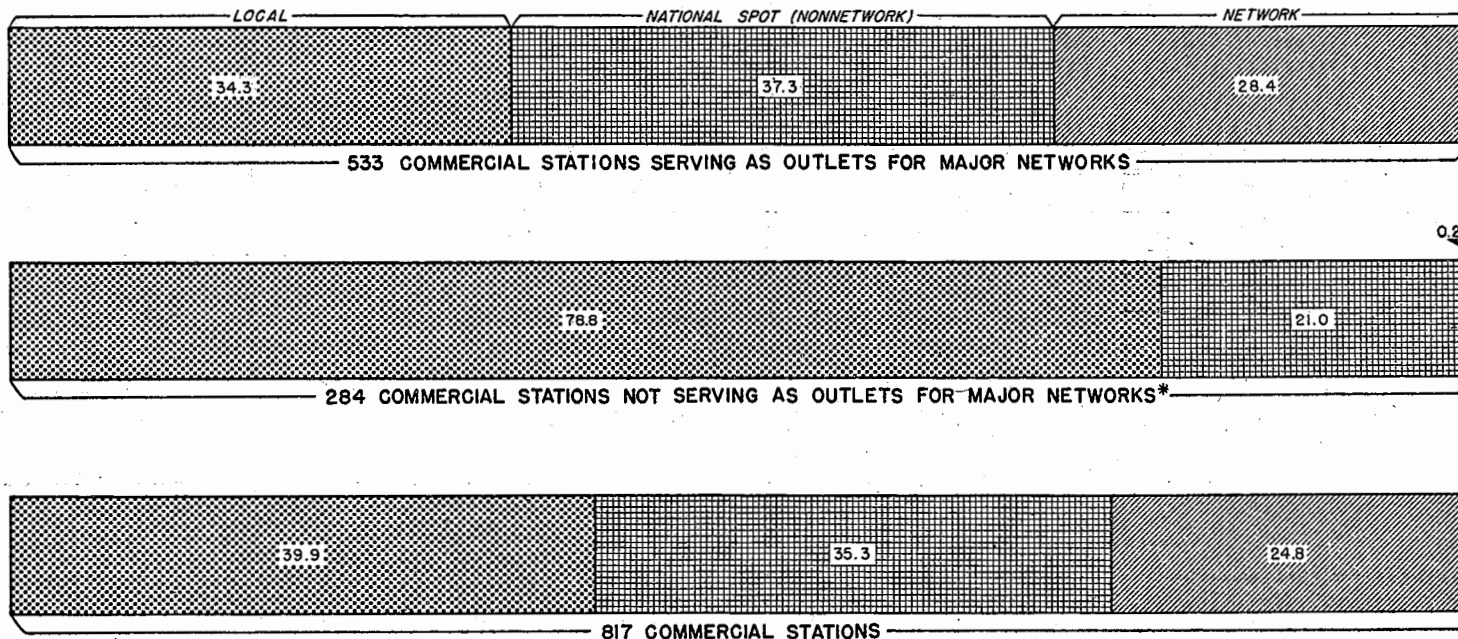

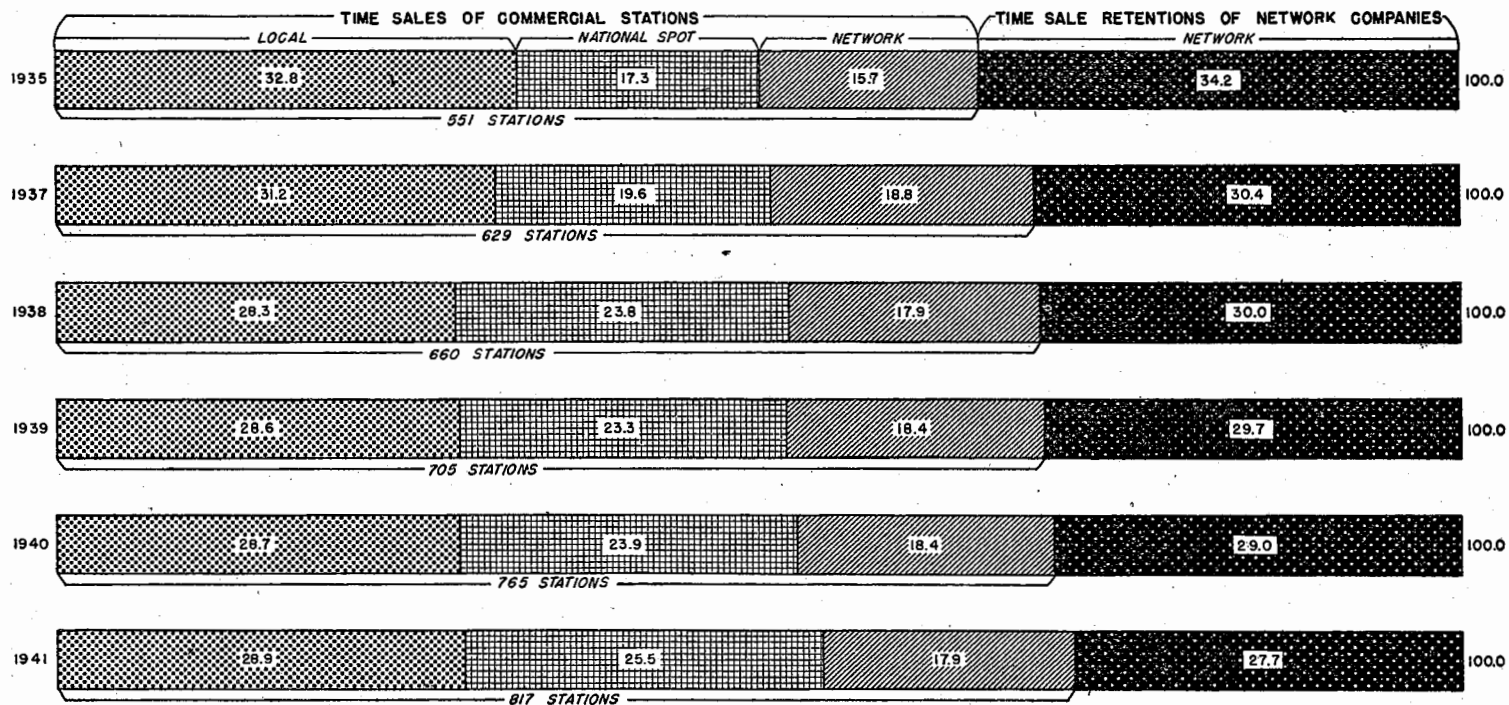
