Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 27.607 and the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau Public Notice DA 07-107, issued on January 18, 2007, Motorola Spectrum, Inc. submits the following required Guard Manager Annual Report:

Per above, Motorola Spectrum, Inc. currently has no spectrum users.

As reported in previous Annual Reports, Motorola is shipping portable, mobile and base equipment capable of operating in and/or specifically developed for the 700 MHz Guard Bands.

Last year's Congressional passage of DTV transition legislation, mandating a 2/17/09 date certain access to the 700 MHz band, and continued Commission efforts to promote access to this band help to diminish uncertainties for potential spectrum users. Near term access to spectrum is a major issue for users who may be considering use of this band, especially if they are considering a universal solution across several MEA's. We believe that a timely resolution by the Commission of the variety of band reconfiguration proposals, related to this and adjacent 700 MHz spectrum bands, currently under consideration is also critical in enabling more widespread use of this band.
