TCNS & E106

- TCNS & E106 are secure databases housed on FCC servers
- Use of TCNS ensures that the appropriate Tribal Nations are notified
- All or almost all Federally-recognized Trial Nations use TCNS
- Permits approved FCC staff to access files and work with all parties to complete reviews in a timely fashion
- No need to send paper files/no need to split filing to accommodate email size limits
- Requires use of an FRN (easy to obtain)
- Please take on-line training before using

- E106 "pulls" TCNS information into Form 620 and 621
- E106 saves time and effort in completing the Form 620 and
 621
- E106 performs internal checks to insure properly completed forms
- E106 will hold forms in draft for 30 days
- E106 provides a record of process and decision archived by FCC
- SHPOs tend to discard Form 620 and Form 621 after 3 years or so. They do keep reports
- Facilitates collocation process for future activity
