The Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) Tribal Library E-Rate Pilot Program is now open for applications. We urge interested Tribal Nations and Tribal Libraries to apply as soon as possible as the Commission is accepting applications on a rolling basis. The **Tribal Library E-Rate Pilot Program** provides one-on-one technical assistance for Tribal libraries through all phases of the E-Rate application and reimbursement processes. Based upon the positive responses and feedback received from participants from last year's Pilot Program, the FCC is continuing this exciting new program. The Commission also made changes to the E-Rate rules to now provide support for eligible Tribal College and University libraries.
