Subject: FCC Announces Nationwide Tests of the Wireless Emergency Alerts and Emergency Alert System on October 4, 2023

Greetings from the Federal Communications Commission's Office of Native Affairs and Policy.

We are writing to inform you that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), in coordination with the FCC, will conduct nationwide tests of Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) and the Emergency Alert System (EAS) on October 4, 2023. The WEA test will begin at 2:18 pm EDT on October 4, 2023, using the National Alert classification of Alert Message. FEMA will send the test message to members of the public with mobile device service from a Commercial Mobile Service provider that participates in WEA. **All wireless providers that have elected to participate in WEA are required to participate in this nationwide test.**

The EAS test will begin at 2:20 pm EDT on October 4, 2023. All EAS Participants are required to participate in the nationwide EAS test. Furthermore, apart from those exceptions listed in the August 3 **Public Notice**, all EAS Participants must make the following required filings in the Commission's EAS Test Reporting System (ETRS):

- Any EAS Participant that must update ETRS Form One to ensure its accuracy must have submitted the update on or before **September 15, 2023**.
- All EAS Participants must file ETRS Form Two to provide "day of test" data on or before **October 5, 2023**.
- All EAS Participants must file ETRS Form Three to provide detailed post-test data on or before **November 20, 2023**.
