Explanation of Effort and Availability of Commercial Equipment

*Provide an explanation of efforts undertaken, and challenges encountered, in permanently removing, replacing, and disposing of covered communications equipment or service.

Since the previous report, my company has not conducted any additional work on the removal of covered equipment since the submittal of the last form. As reported in July 2024, we have completed the removal of covered equipment at 58 of 70 sites. Because of the funding shortfall, however, we are unable to continue with that work. As such, we have stopped project activities pending the resolution of the funding issue. We have spent at least \$8 million more than the available pro-rated reimbursement funding on covered equipment removal, destruction, and replacement activities. There is still removal work to be done. Our overextended financial situation coupled with the prolonged lack of federal action to address the program funding shortfall has made it impossible for us to continue our removal work and related activities. Likewise, since the last report, my company has not conducted work on the disposal of covered equipment since the submittal of the last form. We have spent at least \$8 million over the available pro-rated reimbursement funding on covered equipment removal, destruction, and replacement activities. We have destroyed the covered equipment removed from 58 of 70 sites. However, we are unable to dispose of the equipment from the remaining 12 sites, as we cannot afford to have it removed. In turn, my company has not conducted work on the replacement of covered equipment and services since the submittal of the last form. Consistent with the responses above regarding removal and disposal activities, all replacement work has stopped due to the funding shortfall. As stated, we have "spent" \$8 million above the pro-rated allocation; it should be noted this amount sits on our books as a current payable to primary equipment vendors. Over the past two years, those vendors, being as equally committed to the success of the program as we are, were willing to deliver the replacement equipment and provide the replacement services in advance expecting that the reimbursement funds would be available within a reasonable timeframe. Since that has not happened, those same vendors have become very concerned, and rightfully so, about the collectability due to the age of the associated invoices. If assurances that the reimbursement funding are not given by the federal government soon, these pressures could turn into collection actions, which would most probably lead to disastrous consequences for our operations.

Because of the funding issues, we are not finding that equipment and services are commercially available. Without the additional funds needed to complete this national security replacement mandate, we are unable to proceed with additional work. Simply put, equipment and services that one cannot pay for are not available. To try to overcome the lack of funding during the reporting period, we made additional visits to the offices of elected representatives to plead for action, both in person and virtually, individually and alongside industry association personnel and representatives of other program participants. However, as of this writing, those efforts appear to have been in vain given that nothing has been published to indicate a solution may be near. Beyond these efforts, we have attempted discussions with various commercial entities regarding private funding for the balance of activities. However, the burdens of this federal mandate have created tremendous negative pressures on company operations, causing significant damage to our financial profile. This, coupled with the program funding shortfall and no indication further funding will be addressed soon, we find the notion of commercial financing for the balance of the work needed to be an impossible sell. Compounded by the fact that commercial financing costs are deemed non-reimbursable, even if feasible, this would not be a smart move.

The need to "plug the security holes" in every segment of the national infrastructure has never been greater than today; communications networks are certainly no exception. At the same time, the calls by policy and lawmakers at all levels for better broadband for everyone, everywhere have never been louder. The mandate created by the Secure and Trusted Communications Networks Act of 2019 and the cost reimbursement program that it spawned is laudable. The backward manner in which the program budget was set, and the continued lack of action at the federal level to deal with the funding shortfall created by that misstep, is greatly diminishing its overall effectiveness and crippling many of its subjects. Bot the FCC and Congress need to take action now.

Timeline Deviation: Virtually all sections of the timeline are impacted. We still have elements of the insecure core running. We still have several sites running insecure RAN equipment. Until we installed the replacement equipment at all RAN sites we cannot remove and dispose of the remaining insecure items without signification negative impact on coverage and commercial services. The impact on the timeline is obvious. Without the additional funding, we will not be able to complete the work required and therefore we will not meet the project milestone dates.
