Greetings from the Federal Communications Commission.

On October 16, 2023, the FCC released a <u>Public Notice</u> seeking member nominations for Tribal government representatives to serve on a renewed Native Nations Communications Task Force (Task Force) beginning in 2024. The FCC's Chairwoman will select Task Force members to serve for a three year term. In making selections, the FCC seeks to balance the representation of different geographic regions, subject-matter expertise, and the diversity among Tribal Nations. Applicants must be elected leaders from federally-recognized Tribal governments or governmental entities (e.g., Tribal utility commissions), or their designated employees. New nominations should be in writing and include a description of the nominee's area of expertise and qualifications. Incumbent Task Force members may submit a letter of intent to recommit themselves. Before submitting a nomination, please review the <u>Public Notice</u> for specific instructions about member qualifications, nomination procedures, and other information. Nominations for Task Force membership should be submitted to <u>Native@fcc.gov</u> no later than November 30, 2023.

The Public Notice also extended the current Task Force through December 31, 2023.
