Greetings from the Federal Communications Commission.

The Commission's Wireline Competition Bureau released a <u>Public Notice (DA 24-274)</u> to remind providers that May 2024 will be the last month for which providers will be able to seek reimbursement for the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) benefits passed through to ACP households. Providers are not required to pass through any benefits to ACP households after April 2024. Providers can choose whether to pass on and claim the partial reimbursement for May service.

The Public Notice lists an estimated reimbursement range for each benefit type, within which the partial reimbursement amount may fall. The Commission anticipates it will be able to announce the final maximum reimbursement amount in April.

Earlier this year, the Commission released the <u>ACP Wind-Down Order (DA 24-23)</u> to provide specific guidance to prepare consumers for the end of the ACP. The FCC will continue to update our consumer-facing webpages, including <u>fcc.gov/ACP</u> with the most current information regarding the ACP wind-down.
